Carpenter, KOIN director of sports and special events, will team with Blackburn (well known Portland Beaver baseball broadcaster and sports authority), in an action-filled pre-conference schedule. 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Soil bank demands for alfalfa and other soil-conserving legumes have opened speculation on the Oregon bee population, chief pollinators of the state's four to five million dollar legume seed crop industry.

Reset by insecticides and other chemicals used for modern farming, bees are waging an uphill battle to keep full-staffed for the essential pollination job, Oregon State college scientist reports.

Importance of bees in pollinating alfalfa, clovers, and similar seed crops is outlined in a new circular of information published by the OSC agricultural experiment station. The circular, "Bees for Legume Seed Production," was prepared by H. A. Scullen, professor emeritus of entomology, who retired from OSC in 1955 after 33

years of service to Oregon's bee industry and other fields of entomology.

Research findings on increased seed production through use of bees show, for example, that alfalfa clover seed yield was multiplied 300-fold when bees had access to clover in contrast to plots where bees were excluded. Increases for other seed crops ranged downward to hairy vetch, where yields were still tripled by use of bees.

Work habits of bees and suggestions to persons who provide bees as pollinators are discussed in the 16-page circular. Copies may be obtained from county extension agents or the OSC bulletin clerk, Corvallis.
