Federal Law Due On Brucellosis

A new federal law governing the interstate movement of animals and making certain requirements with respect to the testing or vaccinating of cattle for brucellosis will go into effect January 1, 1957. All cattle moved interstate except steers, spayed heifers and calves under eight months old, come under the federal order on that date.

Dr. A. G. Beagle, head of federal veterinarians in Oregon, says this order is intended to strengthen and support the national brucellosis eradication program. This order is a natural development to tighten up the loose ends of a program of this kind and is not put on the books to trap a lot of animal owners, Dr. Beagle explains. The federal veterinarians will expect compliance with the new order, and to that end are attempting to get details to all owners in Oregon.

To avoid unnecessary curtailment of the normal movement of cattle to stockyards and slaughter establishments, some exceptions are made for interstate movement. After January 1, cattle without a record of test or vaccination may be moved to stockyards and slaughter plants only if these plants have been approved by cooperating federal and state authorities. These establishments must meet certain requirements of the order. The untested or unvaccinated animals crossing state lines may enter the approved yards or plants only if accompanied by an official transportation slip or certificate signed by the owner or shipper. Cattle received at slaughter plants must be for immediate slaughter.

Animals may be released from stockyards only if they meet the interstate brucellosis requirements. In another exception, the chief of the animal disease branch of the U.S.D.A. at Washington has authority to authorize the interstate movement of animals for feeding or grazing purposes only under certain circumstances.

Beagle points out that five states -- Maine, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Washington and Wisconsin -- have qualified as modified-certified free areas. Wisconsin and Washington qualified last June.

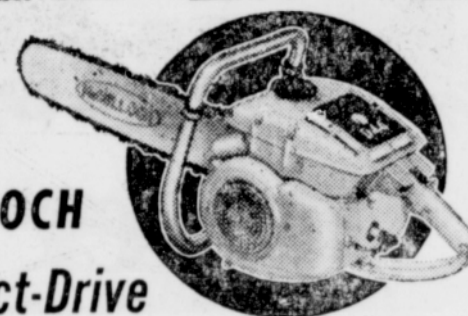

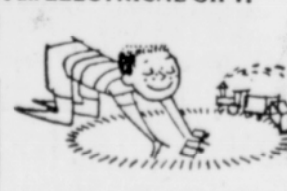
