Time To Prepare Lawns, Fescue Combine Claims

PORTLAND — Now's the time to prepare lawns for seeding later this fall. Oregon county agents advise tilling and grading the soil now and cultivating for the next month.

Such lawn preparation helps establish a weed-free turf for fall-seeded lawns. In much of Oregon, September is an ideal month to plant lawns. By then, the longest, warmest days have passed and good stands of new grass are easier to get.

Preparing the soil involves three steps prior to seeding. First work down the soil to a firm, level surface. Second, keep the soil surface continuously moist for at least three to four weeks to settle the soil and insure good weed seed germination. Third, work and re-work the soil surface lightly until a firm, smooth, finely worked surface is had and weed seedlings have been killed.

Here's a word of warning... do not use chemical weed killers such as 2, 4-D and 2, 4, 5-T to kill weed seedlings at this time. The chemical may prevent germination and development of the grass seedlings.

The most desirable turf grasses for Oregon are Oregon-grown. They are the fine leaf fescues... chewing and creeping red fescue. It is recognized that a good lawn seed mixture for Oregon cent or more of the Oregon fescue grass seed.

Finally, the Oregon Fine Fescue Commission has good news to pass along for those who want to plant lawns on soil pretty thoroughly infested with quack and other wild grasses. Trials with amino triazole show promise of control. A recom-

mendation calls for first working down the area and then, when the quackgrass comes back, rapidly spray with one pound of commercial amino triazole to five gallons of water. This is enough material to treat one thousand square feet.

After a week or ten days, the area may be worked up again, the seed bed prepared and then, after a week, grass seed may be planted.

This treatment will be especially welcome to new home owners who often seek help for controlling quack and other grasses prior to lawn planting. Finally, buy only the best seed available. The seed cost is but a fraction of the cost of establishing a lawn and getting good results.
