The business meeting will open in the afternoon and will include the annual selection of the Pioneer King and Queen to reign over the summer meeting held the last Sunday of July and the election of officers.

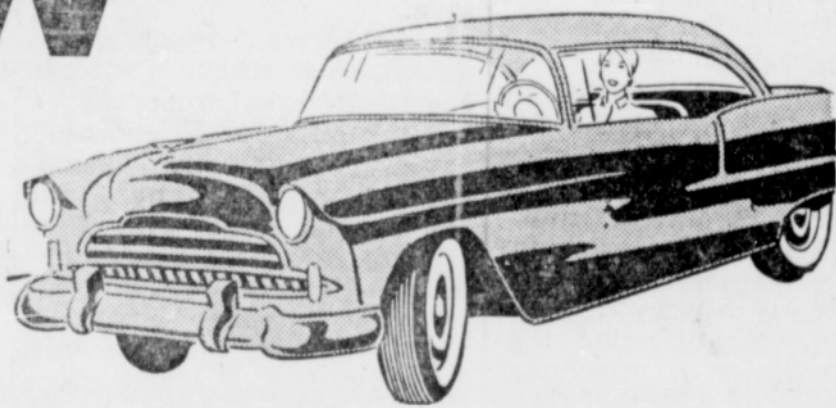
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
