

Another Unofficial Vote Planned On Local Telephone Controversy

Another area-wide vote is to be taken to determine whether or not telephone subscribers on the Sandy exchange want extended toll-free service to Gresham or to Gresham and Portland.

Victor Bodley of Eagle Creek announced the first of the week that petitions are

being prepared and will be circulated among all telephone users in the area to determine their wishes. The completed petitions will then be forwarded to Public Utilities Commissioner Howard Morgan for his study.

Bodley said that the recent poll taken by setting up ballot

boxes in various places throughout the area did not give a full and complete expression of the wishes of telephone users in the Sandy area. Some of these ballots, he said, were not even collected after the balloting had been completed. He further indicated that these ballots were not acceptable by Morgan.

Telephone users will be given three choices in their voting, just as was done by the Sandy Telephone Users' Association in their recent unofficial balloting. Subscribers will be able to say whether they prefer extended service to Gresham only, or to both Gresham and Portland, or to have the service maintained as at present.

Bodley said that regardless of how the balloting comes out, the petitions will be forwarded to Commissioner Morgan's office. He indicated that many users in the rural area are opposed to any extended service that would bring an increase in present telephone bills.

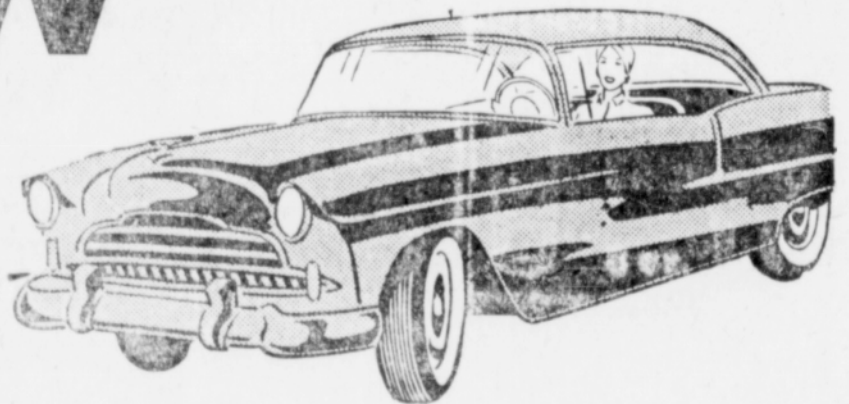
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
