BARKERS POT SHOT

BARKER'S POT SHOTS

Large black bass are beginning to hit, and it might pay good dividends for anglers to give these scrappers a whirl. Lake Lytle, Spring Lake, Coffenburg .. all on the north coast .. have been giving up some good catches recently. So have several south coast lakes and Willamette and Columbia backwaters.

A good enticer at this time of year is the twin shannon spinner with a bright colored bucktail, preferably red. Drag this monstrosity along with an arratic action for best results. What it is about the twin shannon that raises the ire of "Old Man" bass is certainly a mystery. Of all the artificial bass lures, it probably looks the least like something to eat. Nevertheless it's effectiveness is unquestioned, and after all we're trying to take bass.

Another good lure is the silver minnow. For real action hang a two to three-inch strip of pork rind or chamois on the hook for a trailer. Split the trailing ends of the strip up the middle about three-fourths of the way. This will give you two trailers fluttering along behind. Again use an erratic action on the retrieve. Old "Red-eye" will really work up a frenzy at such an offering.

The surprising thing about these early bass is that they'll sock your lure near the surface. So don't go too deep, two or three feet at the most.

Three more ponds in Grant and Union counties will soon be available to the angling public as a result of operational agreements reached by the game commission and the respective landowners. These new fishing areas include the Patterson pond near John Day, the Holmberg pond at Mt. Vernon, and the Vogel pond near Union.

The Patterson and Holm-

berg ponds will be managed by the game commission on a five-year agreement, and the Vogel pond under a ten-year agreement. Renewal of these agreements for angler access will depend entirely upon the conduct of the angling public. All landowners reserve the right to evict persons committing acts of vandalism or other abuses.

This makes a total of 26 privately owned ponds in Baker, Grant, Malheur, Union, and Wheeler counties where agreements or easements have been obtained which permit public fishing. Each pond is managed by the commission for the production of the kind of fish which will produce the best possible angling. Some contain trout, while others have been stocked with varieties of warm-water fish. Total cost of development for all ponds has been around \$900.00.

Willamette anglers will soon have a new boat ramp available for their use and located at one of the most popular spring salmon holes on the river. The access development is about 900 feet beyond the end of the new Steelman road constructed by the game commission last summer at the head of the popular Coon Island salmon area.

A concrete ramp and 30-car parking area are planned at a development cost of around \$4,500.00. The game commission will install the ramp this summer under the Dingell-Johnson Federal Aid program.

Other development at Sauvie Island will include the improvement of the Oak Island road at a cost of \$2,500.00. The Oak Island area is extremely popular to bass, crappie, and catfish anglers.

The Gordon Creek access project on the Sandy river will also get a going over with the development of three-quarters of a mile of road and a parking area. This access site will be completed and available to steelhead anglers by next fall.

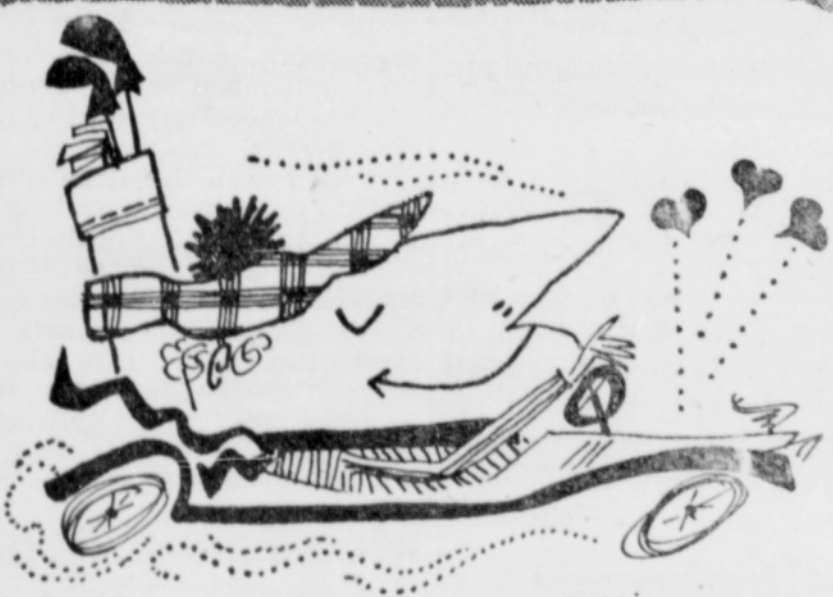
