Mr. and Mrs. Harry Wright enjoyed a day at the beach Sunday with friends from Forest Grove. They picnicked at Bar View.

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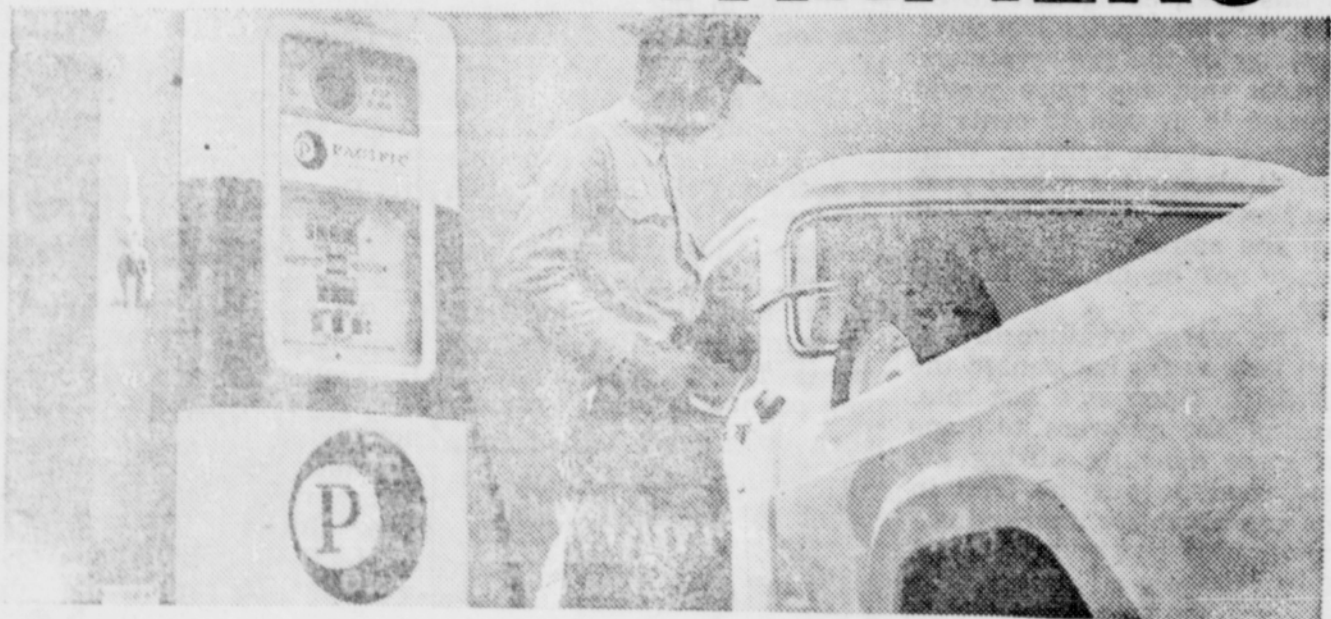
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
