

Over-Flow Crowd Attends Annual Seventh Day Adventist Encampment

The largest crowd in the history of the Oregon Conference Seventh-day Adventist camp meeting held annually at Gladstone Park, thronged the 74-acre campground site for the first weekend of the July 17-26 encampment. Nearly 17,000 were on the grounds Saturday for worship services.

A huge overflow crowd jammed the 6,000 seat main pavilion and overflowed into the plaza area with many hundreds having to stand as Elder John Hancock, Northwest youth leader, challenged the huge congregation to accept the saving grace of Jesus Christ during the Saturday 11 AM worship service. A full schedule of meetings were held beginning with the 7 AM devotional service.

The 9:30 AM Sabbath school was conducted by Elder George Belleau, Oregon conference Sabbath school secretary. The 3 PM afternoon program featured Elder E. D. Hansan, mission leader from Tanganyika, East Africa. Elder L. G. Whitten, Oregon conference publishing depart-

ment secretary, presided over a program paying tribute to the colporteurs, those who sell Christian books and periodicals, at 4:45.

Climaxing Saturday's program in the main auditorium was a giant religious liberty rally featuring Glenn Archer, executive director of the PO-AU.

In addition to the meetings in the main auditorium, simultaneous meetings were held in five other auditoriums for various age groups. The cradle roll, primary, kindergarten, junior and senior youth groups all had a full schedule of services.

With no Seventh-day Adventist church services being held in Sandy during the two weekends of the camp meeting, most of the congregation will be in attendance at Gladstone Park at least on weekends.
