

Wholesale Produce Dealers Must Now Keep All Records

Effective July 11, every wholesale dealer who buys produce in Oregon from a grower on any basis other than for cash, must keep a record or receipt of the transaction. The original receipt must be given to the grower at the time the produce is received or picked up, whichever date is sooner.

An order to this was signed recently by Agriculture Director Robert J. Steward and Frank McKennon, chief of the state department of agriculture's division of plant industry.

The order stipulates that the record or receipt must

give the name, address and license number of the produce dealer, the name and address of the grower or producer and the conditions of the produce upon receipt. The receipt must also bear the date the produce is received, the amount of produce, the date payment is to be made and the total price to be paid. The dealer's verification that the required statements are correct must also appear on the receipt.

Oregon law defines a whole sale produce dealer as "any person who deals in, handles or trades in produce and who does not operate exclusively as a grower, retailer or ware-

houseman; but this definition does not include any person who, at the time of obtaining possession or control of any produce, pays the full agreed price therefor in cash and does not resell the produce within this state."

The original request for action along these lines came from producers in southern Oregon through Ward Spatz, Medford, who represents horticultural interests on the state board of agriculture.
