Traffic Count Shows Decrease

Oregon highway traffic decreased 1.3 per cent in June 1958, compared to June 1957, according to the State Highway Department's monthly traffic count recorded at 46 rural counter locations located throughout the state.

General decreases were revealed on most highway routes leading to the coast.

On the basis of the Highway Department's traffic count, rural highway traffic for the first 6 months of 1958 was 0.7 per cent greater than for the same period in 1957, while urban traffic showed a 2.1 per cent increase during this period.

Oregon gasoline consumption increased 2.85 per cent during May 1958, as compared to May 1957, with an overall increase of 1.39 per cent for the first 5 months of 1958.

Many License Tabs Now Due

Oregon motorists planning an August or early September vacation were reminded by the Department of Motor Vehicles today to check the expiration date of their license plates.

To avoid overlooking renewal of license plates, vehicle owners whose tabs expire in

August were urged to renew them early to avoid the end-of-the-month rush or the possibility of forgetting them in the rush of a vacation.

Approximately 69,000 license plates will be renewed in August with an expected 4,000 new registrations.

Renewals should be made by sending the current registration certificate, completed with required information on the reverse side, with a ten dollar check or money order to the Department of Motor Vehicles, Registration Division, Capitol Building, Salem.
