

Program Set For Area

William Dickman, chairman, and Hallene Price, secretary, Clackamas county Great Decisions Council and William Lewis, Clackamas county grange deputy attended a district meeting in Portland to complete plans for Clackamas County's participation in the "Great Decisions 1959" program.

Dickman explains the "Great Decisions 1959" program this way: "A group of neighbors or friends (usually 6 to 14 in number) decide they wish to become better informed on some of the domestic and foreign policy is-

sues that will confront the U. S. in 1959. The Great Decisions program through its fact sheet furnishes much good information upon which to base discussion. Radio, TV and newspapers will also provide supplemental information. A well informed public is the object of the program. We might call it a study group in foreign policy, set up on a discussion group basis in which each member shares his knowledge as he learns."

There are 10 subjects in the 1959 series—the first two dealing with Oregon history and its future potential. The subjects included in the series are:

January 25—1859 - 1959, Building Today's Oregon.

February 1—What Oregon Frontiers for the Future.

February 8—Will Alliances Keep the Peace.

February 15—Are We Realistic About Communist Power.

February 22—Peace in the Middle East - Whose Job.

March 1—A Better Neighbor Policy for Latin America.

March 8—What U.S. Policies in the World Economic Revolution.

March 15—The New Technology - For Destruction or Plenty.

March 22—What Kind of World is Possible.

March 29—What Challenges to Diplomat and Citizen.

Dickman reports approximately 350 participated in Clackamas County last year with over 5000 participants within the state. During the next three weeks, Clackamas county discussion groups will be organizing ready for the starting date January 25.
