ETN3 John R. Bartley was one of the first of an initial student group of about 115 enlisted men who started at the basic nuclear power school which the Navy has established at Mare Island Shipyard, Vallejo, California. The course covers 6 months.

The students will learn the academics of nuclear power—mathematics, physics, fundamental technology on reactors. From the Mare Island school, the students will go to Naval nuclear power training units of the Atomic Energy Commission for actual operation lessons in atomic power plants.

Graduates become eligible for duty on nuclear powered navy craft.
