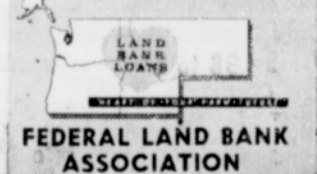

New Ticket Buying System For Coliseum

Twenty-two ticket outlets have been established in the metropolitan area to accommodate persons wanting to attend functions in Portland's new Memorial Coliseum. Manager Don Jewell has reported.

The newly established ticket-buying system went into operation for the first time Friday, offering tickets for the Coliseum's first attraction, Holiday on Ice, which opens the night of November 3.

The is how the system works:
A person goes to an agency in his area. The agency phones the Coliseum ticket office directly, reserves specified

seats for the customer who receives a receipt for his money. The customer presents his receipt at the Coliseum ticket office when he appears there and gets his tickets.

'We want to make it as easy as possible throughout the area to obtain tickets for Coliseum events, and this system should work very well,' Jewell said, explaining that similar systems are in operation in other parts of the country.

In Portland there are 10 agencies on the east side, one downtown and another in northwest. There is one in Gresham, it is in the Gresham

Drug Company. Each agency will have an identifying "sticker" conspicuously displayed.

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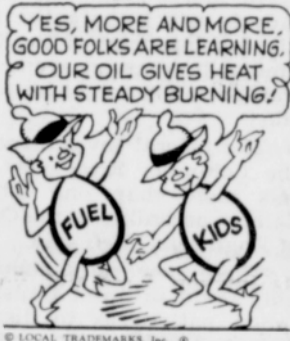
