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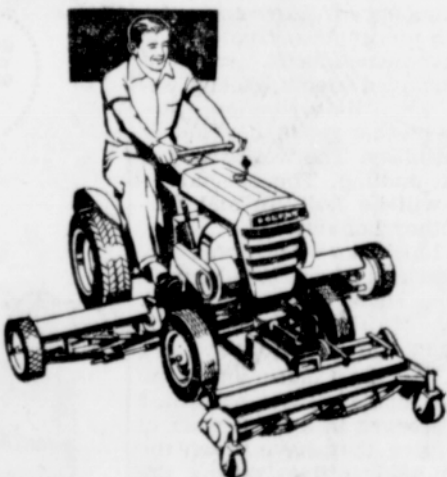

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Low-Income Family Food Program to Go Into Effect First Week of June

The federal surplus food distribution program is scheduled to go into effect in Clackamas county around June 5, according to the County Welfare Department. The distribution center leased by the county for this program is at the site of the old Luther's store, 904 Molalla avenue, Oregon City.

Some 1,500 welfare recipients now receiving aid in Clackamas county are automatically eligible to participate in the program. Another estimated 2,600 members of low income bracket families were expected to register last week for monthly food rations under the Federal Surplus Food Act, according to Miss Bernice Thomas, welfare administrator for the county.

Clients of the welfare department did not have to register since they are automatically eligible.

Each registration is for a three-month period and then renewals should be made at the distribution center.

Persons who are unable to pick up monthly food rations may send in a family representative if identified on the registration slip, according to Miss Thomas.

Eligibility for surplus commodities require that recipients have cooking facilities and a net cash income for 30 days prior to registering, which is under the minimum income set by the Surplus Food Act.
