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Sandy, Estacada Driver Exams Cut

Sandy and Estacada are among the 20-odd Oregon communities which will be affected by a major re-scheduling of drivers license examination schedules effective July 1, according to Sandy City Recorder Ruth Loundree.

The changes, the first in many years, mean that drivers license examinations will no longer be available in Sandy or Estacada. The last examination in Sandy was June 8.

Elimination of drivers tests here and eight other western Oregon communities are being made in an effort to lower cost of conducting examinations by concentrating them in fewer areas. The end result, according to Vern L. Hill, director of the Department of Motor Vehicles, will permit examiners to be available to the public for more hours each week by reducing travel time loss.

Mrs. Loundree said she was told by examiners that the Sandy closure was because drivers tests were too costly per applicant. Applicants from the Sandy-Estacada area may now go to Gresham, Portland or Oregon City where examinations are offered five days a week.

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Improvement Is Seen in Lumber

Gradual improvement was noted in both lumber and plywood markets last week by Crow's Lumber Market News service of Portland. The general downtrend in prices of lumber has been halted, and a moderate price recovery has taken place in isolated instances.

The green fir dimension market showed more activity in the midwestern markets, Crow's reported, and mill order files are being extended on most Std&Btr items. California demand has been disappointing, although sales of 2x6 are reported as fair, and some demand for long length 2x8 is reported. Eastern markets have not been overly active for fir and hemlock cargo loadings. Crow's reported, mostly due to arrivals of stocks bought earlier at lower prices.

Fir plywood has maintained a steady \$68 level for sanded stock, although isolated surplus sales continue to be reported at \$66. In sheathing, most sales of 5/8 inch are at \$98, up slightly from two weeks ago.

Pine boards have been quiet this week, Crow's reported, with little demand for numbers 2 and 3 common grades. Dry dimension from the Pine area shows token improvement, mostly in White Fir.

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Eagle Creek Surrenders Old Log Jam

A log jam that has hindered free passage of salmon and steelhead since the early 1920's has been removed from Eagle Creek, Virgil Summers, chief field engineer for the Oregon Fish Commission, announced last week.

The jam, located near Eagle Creek post office, was an accumulation of logging and flood debris dating back to 1923. The barrier was 200 feet long, 150 wide, and 14 feet deep.

During periods of high water, the jam floated up sufficiently to allow fish to pass beneath. At most water stages, however, the collection prevented both salmon and steelhead from completing their upstream spawning run.

Last year the fish commission opened a passageway through the jam so fish could pass upstream. During early June this year, a crew led by Bud Zumwalt, commission stream improvement foreman, attacked the jam, removing the long-standing barrier with the aid of power saws and heavy equipment.

The logs and other debris were shoved high up on the bank and trees were planted to stabilize it, according to the commission office.

Now that the 38-year accumulation of debris has been removed, the commission is bulldozing a new channel in the streambed so that this fall's fish can reach spawning areas.

Both the emergency work last season and this year's clearance operation were financed with funds from the federal Columbia River Fishery Development program.
