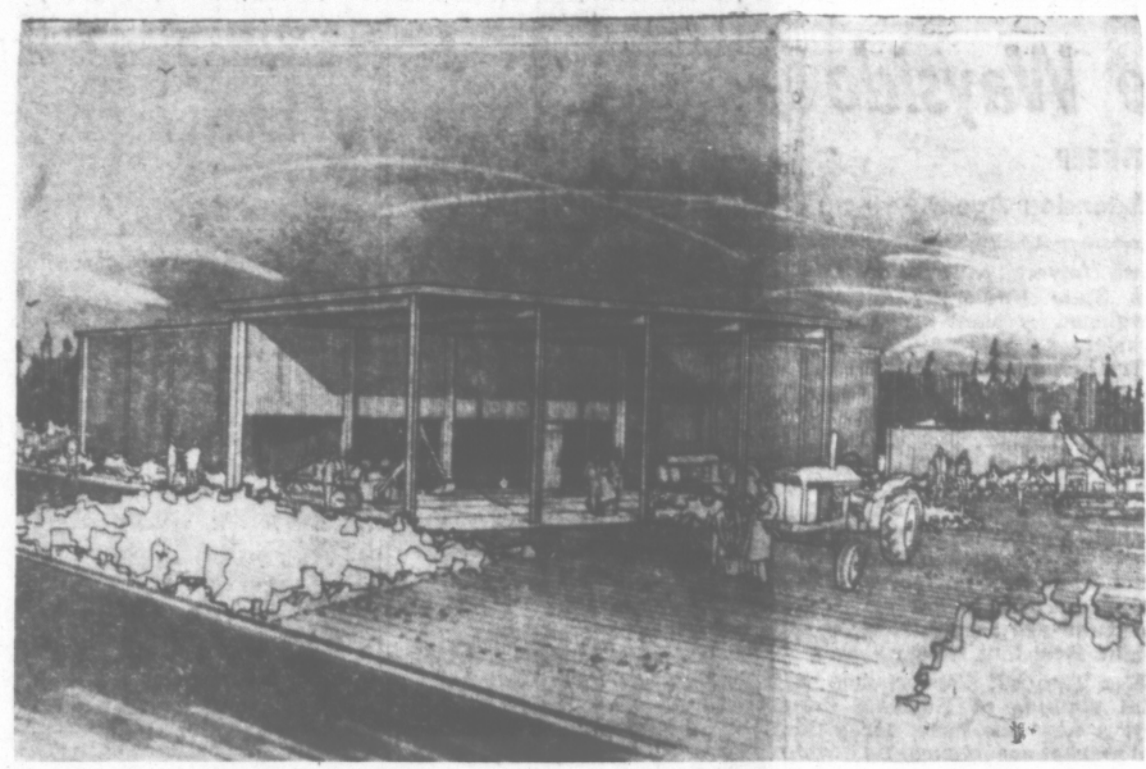

Morrison which the firm has occupied for a dozen years.
