Fred Proctor Jr. is up and around again after a bout with a sprained back.

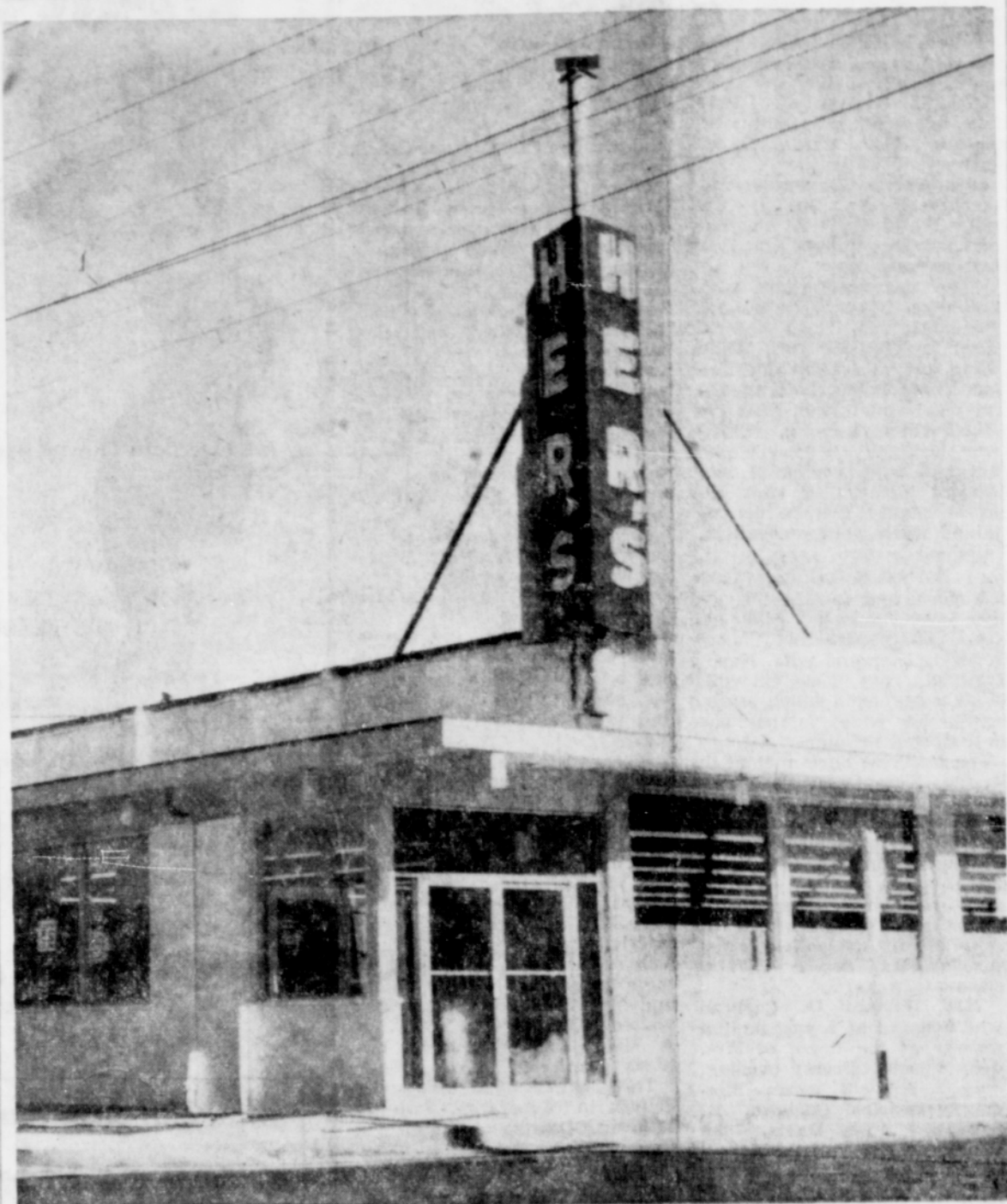
