# Late Surge by Prineville Surprises Pioneers, 25-7

Sandy made four mistakes and each of them cost a touchdown as Prineville roared to a 25-7 victory over the Pioneers Friday night on the home football field.

Sandy, looking good throughout the ball game, was generally unable to move the ball in the clinches. The Pioneers were very much in the game for three quarters of play, however. The game was tied 7-7 until late in the third quarter. The Crook County Cowboys from Prineville added two more tallies in the last half of the final period to sew up the result.

**Barden Throws**

Sandy's main weapon was the impressive arm of quarterback Gary Barden. Most of his heaves were on target, but his receivers had a bad night. Halfback Dennis Cutsforth was a workhorse on both offense and defense.

The first tally came late in the opening quarter when fullback Ken Larsen found an opening to his liking in the Sandy line, and rambled 80 yards down the grandstand sideline to a touchdown. Tailback Dick Sigman skirted right end for the conversion point.

A disaster was in the making when Sandy fumbled the kickoff, but the Pioneers held for downs, and a 20-yard left end by Cutsforth carried the Pioneers into Prineville territory.

**Score Tied**

The teams traded punts a couple of times, and Cutsforth was back again to punt when he bobbled the pass from center, picked up the ball, and with as-

istance from interference showed some polished running around left end for 16 yards. Barden passed to Dan Nichols for 18 yards to the Prineville nine, and three plays later Cutsforth ran end for the final three yards on a well-faked handoff. The conversion kick by Barden tied the score at 7-all with two minutes 43 seconds left in the hurry of Barden passes in the final minutes of the half reached the Prineville 30.

**Final Half**

Early in the next half Sandy was backed up to its own goal-line and Cutsforth kicked out the ball was bobbled by Prineville at the Sandy 27 and Nichols picked it out of midair, but Sandy failed to move the ball.

The teams traded punts, and a pass catch by Cutsforth put the Pioneers on their own 37. Three more passes fell incomplete, though, and Sandy punted to the Prineville 42. On next down Severance shot through the

line and covered all 56 yards for the tie-breaking touchdown. A line play for the extra point was stopped.

**Clincher Tally**

Thanks largely to two penalties Sandy bounced back to the Prineville 25, but fumbled. On Sandy's next series of downs, Back-Clyde Shumway intercepted a Barden pass after the ball had been deflected by the intended receiver. The play covered about 50 yards to the Sandy five. Two plays later Severance ran right end for a TD, and again the conversion run was stopped. The visitors, however, held a commanding 19-7 lead with just over 6 minutes left in the game.

**Final Score**

The next time Prineville got the ball the Cowboys drove to the Sandy 27. Quarterback Dick Nichols faded to pass, was thwarted, but then ran left end all the way to score. A pass fell incomplete on the extra

point attempt to leave the score 25-7.

A futile last minute Sandy attack ended with a pass interception at the Prineville 41 on the game's final play.
