organization. He is also the only male past president of the PTA. "We had good male attendance that year," he recalled, "the meetings began and ended on time."

He is a past master of the Sandy Masonic lodge, Civil Defense radiation detection course graduate and a past reader, past president and present soloist of the Sandy Christian Science church.

And not among the least of his civic duties is his service on the summer recreation board—first of its kind in the area.

And if anyone is qualified to set up a sports program it's Metsger. He's a football, basketball, tennis and handball player, ice skater, ski jumper, golfer, runner, bowler, swimmer, fisherman, hunter — ad infinitum.

Being somewhat of a "runt" in high school led him to develop prowess in all these sports. But he's become a spectator in some — especially football.
