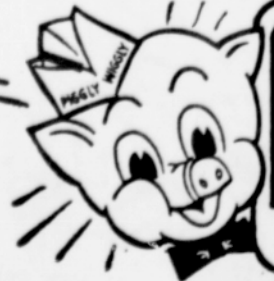

Assault Story Reported False

A Portland motorist has admitted he invented a story about being assaulted on Gordon Creek Rd. recently, sheriff's deputies reported last week.

At the same time the driver, Harlan L. Hollingsworth, told officers he was responsible for a hit-and-run accident which occurred just before the alleged assault Dec. 15.

Hollingsworth first reported he was beaten up by two youths when he stopped and offered them a ride. Officers said, however, that after further questioning Hollingsworth said he "guessed" his story of the assault was an "hallucination."

The 54-year-old telephone company official told deputies he drove to the Springdale area to try to locate a friend whose car was stuck. He admitted, deputies said, that he had been drinking, and could not remember everything that transpired.

Officers said they believe Hollingsworth's injuries, which consisted primarily of a laceration over an eye, were incurred when his car struck one driven by Bernard Perez of Portland. Perez was not injured.

Alien Report Due in January

District Director Alfred J. Urbano of the Immigration and Naturalization Service stated that the annual alien address report program usually causes a sharp rise in the number of applications for naturalization.

The law requires all aliens in the United States, with few exceptions, to report their addresses each January.

Aliens not required to make this report are diplomats, those accredited to certain international organizations and those who have entered temporarily as agricultural laborers.

Forms for making the reports will be available to aliens at all Post Offices and offices of the Immigration and Naturalization Service during the month of January.

New 4-H Leader Meetings Told

New 4-H leaders and others interested in 4-H Club work are invited to attend one of two meetings scheduled Thursday, Jan. 10. The first will be at 10 a.m. at the Portland Federal Savings building in Milwaukie. The other is set for 8 p.m. at the Thora B. Gardiner Junior high school in Oregon City.

The program at each will include an explanation of 4-H club work, the responsibilities of a leader, club meetings, 4-H activities, and the organization of a 4-H club. Two meetings are scheduled so that persons wishing to attend can select the one most convenient for them.

CANCER DETECTION

Approaching the new year with cautious optimism, the American Cancer Society estimates that about 111 persons in Clackamas county will be saved from cancer in 1963, according to Mrs. Raymond E. Vaughn of Gladstone, who is chairman of the society's unit in this county. They will be among the 177,000 Americans who will be saved from the disease in the coming year, thanks largely to early detection and to prompt and proper treatment.
