Lancers, Sandy Ready For Wilco Hoop Chase

Wilco league basketball teams will begin the 1963 campaign Friday night with four teams — Molalla, Sandy, Jesuit and Reynolds — cast in the favorite's role.

Molalla, 10th ranked in the state last week, was knocked from the undefeated ranks, 47-45, by Lake Oswego Saturday night. Sandy was bumped by Tigard, 65-64.

Reynolds is undefeated in seven pre-season starts, but the Lancers fell to Jesuit, 22-13, in the Wilco jamboree last Friday.

In other abbreviated "games" Friday, Sandy shaded Parkrose, 25-20; Molalla stopped Scappoose, 27-22; and Wy cast prevailed over Silverton, 26-20.

Reynolds tripped Newberg, 46-39, Saturday night at Newberg with Ross Dappen getting 18 points. The Lancers rolled up an 18-8 first-quarter edge and never were headed.

Sandy lost a barn-burner to Tigard. Bob Lamb sunk a field goal with only eight seconds remaining to give Tigard the win. Sandy was well in front most of the way but the winners rallied late in the going.

Dan Nichols of Sandy paced both teams with 27 points while Lamb led Tigard with 23.

In the jamboree the preceding night, Curt Markus had four points, best for the Lancers, while Sandy's Dale Carpenter paced his team with eight. The summaries:

Cyclists Fined For Forest Run

Two motorcyclists were fined a \$100 each for disregarding an official sign and removing a barrier to buzz around in the highly restricted Bull Run area of the Mt. Hood National Forest. Judge Howard Blanding presided at the recent sessions of Clackamas county district court at which Earl Johnson, 28, and Clark Gable, 25, pleaded guilty.

The two men protested the penalties however, claiming they did no damage, and disputed the charge that they removed or violated a barrier to get into the Bull Run watershed.

Judge Blanding suspended \$50 of each fine. The highly restrictive regulations imposed in the Bull Run forest are to protect the Portland water supply, which originates there, from contamination.

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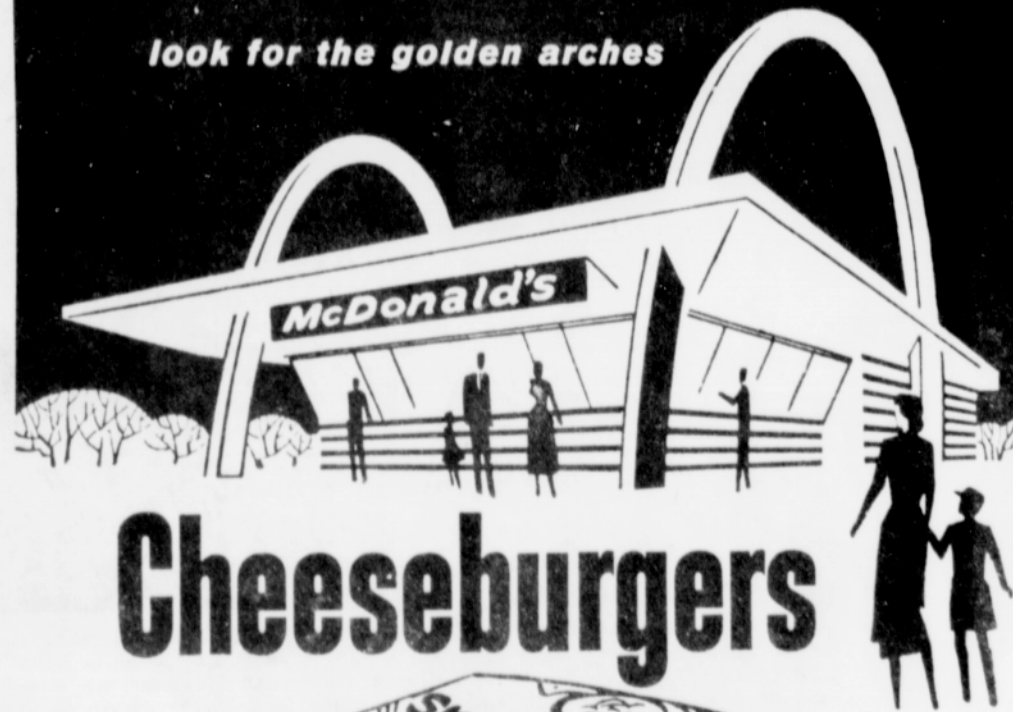
