The main reason the family lives out on suburban acreage, Marilyn admitted, was so that she could indulge her love of raising horses. Horses are Marilyn's hobby and may well be the directing force of her career.

She belonged to the choir at Sandy high for two years, the drum majorettes for three years, was a member of Future Homemakers Club, Girls Athletic Assn., and, in her freshman year was honored by being chosen chapter Sweetheart of the Future Farmers of America.

In her junior year she was the junior football homecoming princess and the junior prom princess.

This year she has already been senior homecoming football princess and is also a member of Majorettes Club.

Outdoor Sports Fan
An outdoor sports fan, Marilyn is fond of hunting and fishing. She works weekends in the ski shop at Multnomah, but lack of snow on the mountain has done her out of a job the last few weekends.

Her love of horses has never intruded so far in Marilyn's life as to dim her interest in dancing and boys and all the things a pretty girl usually finds herself swept into.

"I like dancing," she said, "and I like boys." There is, she admitted, a steady boy friend in her life, though she preferred not to name him.

Her domestic instincts, she said, come in "moods." She says she has "sewing moods," "cooking moods" and "cleaning moods," but finds it hard to get enthusiastic about planned domestic work.

She does definitely plan for marriage and a family later on, though, and has done some serious thinking about the qualities that she would like her husband to have. Above all, he must be trustworthy and honest, she says.

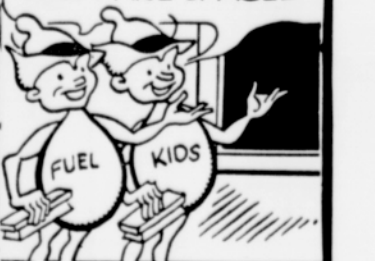
