A discussion of the minimum driving age in Oregon highlighted the meeting last Tuesday of the Sandy Grade School PTA.

Lyle Jarvis, Sandy high teacher, moderated a panel discussion on "Should the Age for Driver's Licenses Be Raised To 18?"

Participants included Steve Hiebert, David Whitlock and Bob Woodward Jr., 8th grade students; fathers Bob Woodward, driver training instructor of Sandy high; Tom Cutsforth of the Clackamas County sheriff's office; and Ralph Hames, local businessman.

Legislators currently are considering bills to raise the age to 18 but most states have a minimum of 16. The consensus seemed to be that the age

should be left at 16 but with some restrictions on youngsters between 16 and 18.

Students felt driver education should begin at the 8th grade level.

A representative of the Boy Scouts of America was on hand and presented Bill Dyal with the charter for the Sandy Cub Scout pack. Dyal, institutional representative, presented the charter of Mrs. Tom Boothby, president of the sponsoring PTA.

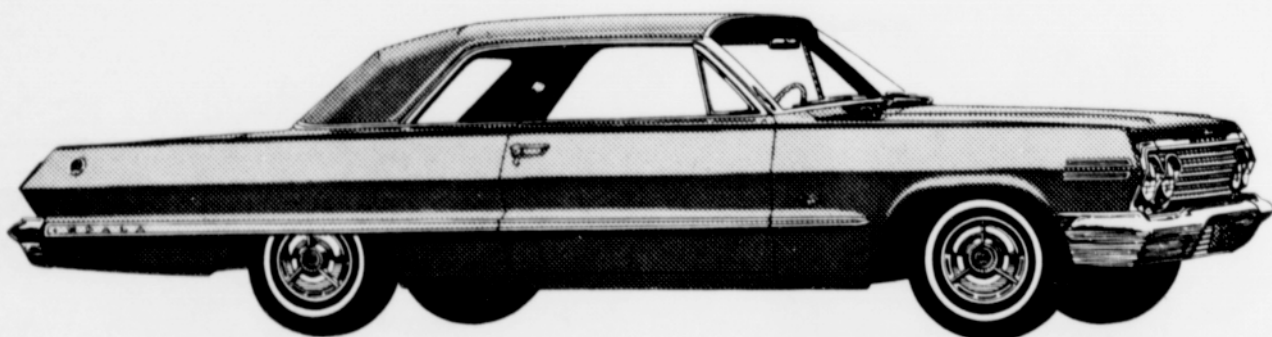
The board of deacons is in charge of the program which begins with dessert at 6:30, with devotions and speaker following.

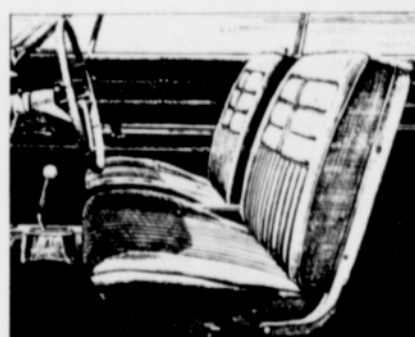
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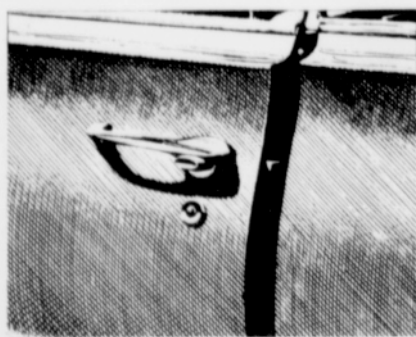
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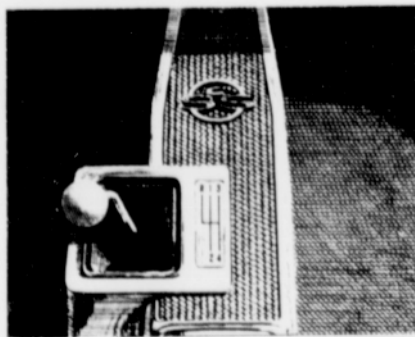
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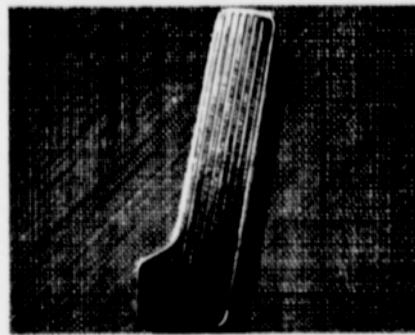
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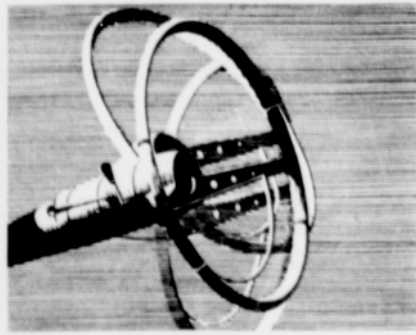
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Chapel Youth Hold 'Aloha'
