There will be no school on Thursday, May 23. The bus will leave an hour later on Friday.

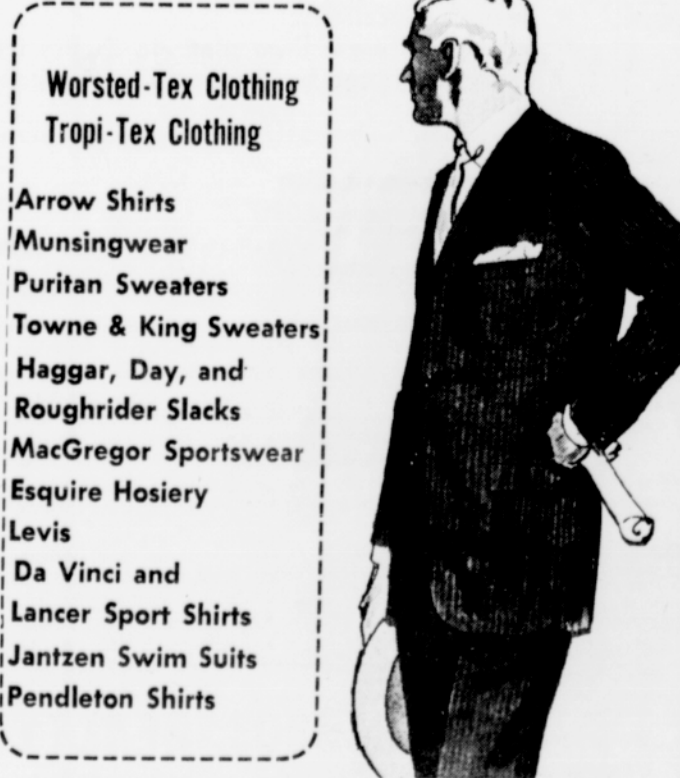
day, May 24, and a school assembly will begin at 10 a.m. Everyone is invited to this assembly where letters and awards for the year will be made.
