A one-car accident near Brightwood injured a Portland man, Robert Revere Uren Jr., and damaged the front end of his car.

Sgt. Tom Cutsforth of the Clackamas county sheriff's office, said Uren was still behind the wheel of his car when Cutsforth arrived. He was incoherent and appeared to have suffered a severe cut over his right eye.

Skidmarks indicated that the car had been going west on Highway 26 when it failed to make a left turn and hit the guard rail twice before running off the roadway into the ditch, Cutsforth said.

Charles Russell Spencer of Warm Springs saw the accident and gave first aid to the injured man.
