## Migrant Council Holds Meet

An inter-church committee of the Clackamas - East Multnomah County Migrant Council worked out a set of rules for distributing donated clothing to needy families of the area. The committee, headed by Mrs. Fred S. King, met Thursday in the old telephone building at 123 Main.

The rules drawn up at the meeting state: at least three people shall be on duty at all times; a worker will not leave the building to secure change; each recipient of clothing must have a referral card which will be checked.

In addition to the alphabetical file, a chronological file

will be kept. Clothing will be distributed to an individual and a record of these will be kept.

There will be a small charge for all apparel unless special instructions appear on the referral card.

A schedule was drawn up delineating the hours each volunteer would serve at the building throughout the summer. The referral card system, which will be used to insure against abuse of the program, was explained to the committee.

Referral cards have been distributed to the churches represented to the Clackamas County Welfare Office, the Sandy Woman's club, the Business and Professional Women's club and B. D. & F. Farm Growers. More cards will be mailed this week. Anyone desiring referral cards may obtain them from Mrs. Fred S. King or Rev. Ed Neuenfeldt.

### State Takes Bids On County Projects

The State Highway Commission will receive bids on three Clackamas county projects on June 4.

Plans on one of the projects call for a new bridge over the Molalla river as part of an improvement on the Canby-Aurora Hill Section of Pacific Highway East (99E). This project is 2.43 miles in length and will provide a four-lane highway with a paved median four to sixteen feet wide. The new bridge will be for southbound traffic. The project includes grading, paving, and the new structure.

The second project includes grading and paving of 0.14 mile of N. W. Wade St. in Estacada, a two-lane street which has received excessive wear due to heavy traffic volume to a saw and planing mill. The project is expected to be completed in the fall of 1963.

A rock production project is located four miles west of Government Camp on the Mt. Hood highway. The project is to produce 14,100 cubic yards of crushed rock in stock pile. The completion date is the fall of 1963.

## Zone Change Hearing Due

A public hearing on the ordinance to amend Zone R-2 and add zones R-3 and R-4 is scheduled for Tuesday evening, June 4, at the city hall.

The R-2 zone is a medium density residential zone that permits single family dwellings, duplexes, agricultural use of land, boarding or rooming houses, apartments, churches, parks, fire stations, museums, etc., limited grazing, hospital, nursing home, home for aged, schools of all types and utility substation or pumping station with no equipment.

It requires a minimum area of 5,000 square feet for one and two family dwellings and 2500 square feet for each living unit for apartments.

Zone R-3 would be a low density apartment and residential area. The uses permitted are the same as for zone R-2 with the exception that no agricultural use of land or grazing is listed. Minimum areas are 5,000 square feet for one and two family dwellings and 1500 square feet for apartment units.

Medium Density Zone R-4, termed a medium density apartment and residential zone allows the same uses permitted in zone R-3. Minimum area for one and two family dwellings is also the same as R-3, but permits smaller apartment units — as little as 800 square feet per unit.
