## Deputies Probe Cabin Burglaries

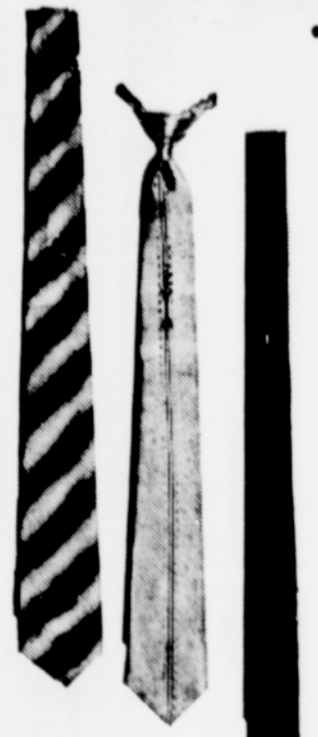
Burglaries of five cabins on Larch Mountain road east of Corbett were reported to the Gresham sheriff's precinct last weekend.

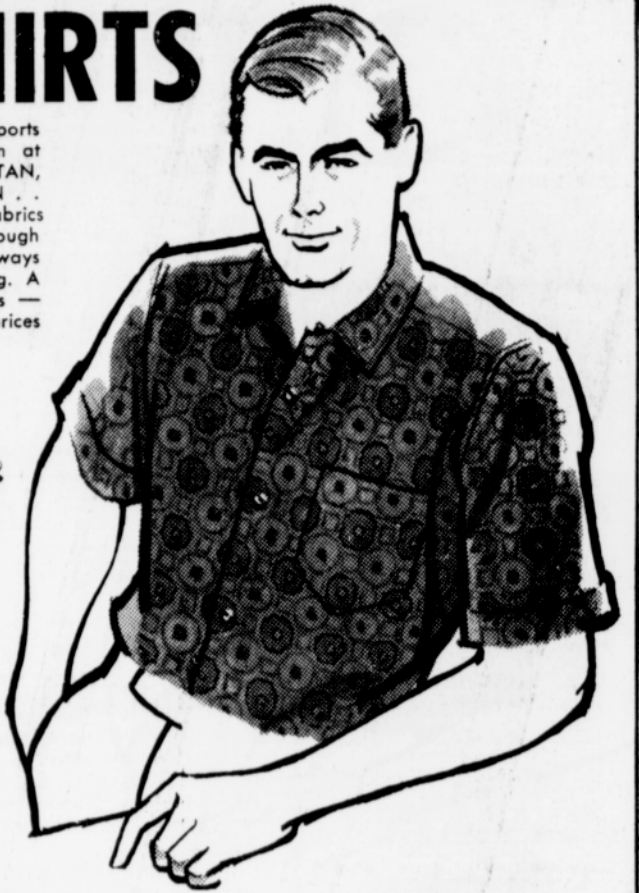

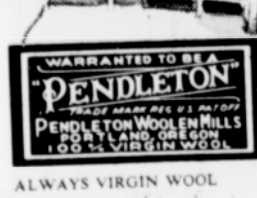
