### Turtles Race On Mountain

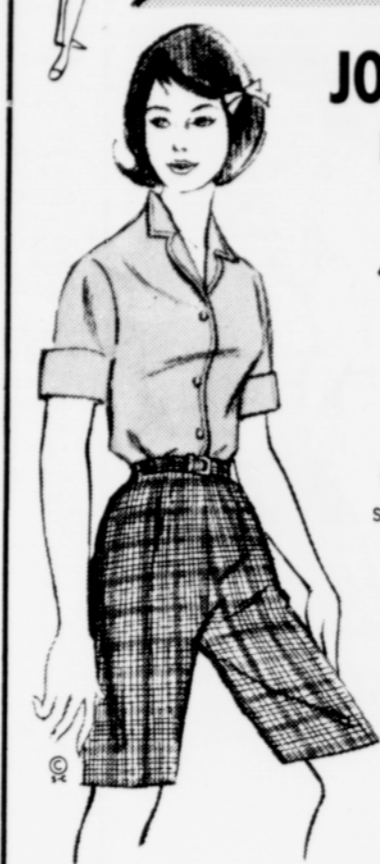
