The Coast Guard reminded boat owners today that most boating accidents must be reported within five days. In Oregon all boating accidents resulting in death or injury to any persons or property damage in excess of \$100 must be reported to R. G. Rittenhouse, Director, Oregon State Marine Board, Room 311, State Capital Building, Salem. If loss of life results from the accident, a report must be

made within 48 hours. All other accidents must be reported within five days.

## BLM Reforests 37,000 Acres

During the last year the Bureau of Land Management reforested 37,000 acres of public lands in Oregon. Of that total, 21,000 acres were planted with young seedlings and 16,000 acres were seeded. It took 9,529,000 seedlings and 12,913 pounds of seed to do the job. Douglas fir and ponderosa pine are the predominant species used for reforestation, but BLM also plants a fair amount of sugar pine in southern Oregon.

Waiting for Montgomery Ward to open recently, I visited the old Forestry Building which is just across the street. This massive structure was built in 1905 for the Lewis and Clark Fair and has been carefully preserved. It is the largest log cabin in the world with its huge Douglas fir columns inside the building forming a cathedral like forest aisle 206 feet long. Each log, and there are 52 of them, is 54 feet high and contains 8500 bd. feet, enough to build an average size house.

One has a feeling of awe when standing among those forest giants. There are many interesting things to see in the building; part of an old rail fence from the Coffee Farm, Marion county, which dates back to 1850; natural buggy shafts, square cornered (I thought nature never did anything but curves. She slipped up that time).

**Port Orford Plank**  
There is a heven plank from a Port Orford cedar, 100 inches wide, 5 1/2 inches thick and 15 ft. long. There is an unusual burl of western red cedar; panels of various western woods; ash, alder, oak, big leaf maple, western hemlock and many more.

I was particularly impressed with the panel made of Pacific Madrone. A miniature old time saw mill is reminiscent of logging operations way back when. The history of present forest management is graphically shown. For those who haven't visited this building, it will certainly be well worth your while. There is a very courteous and capable attendant who delights in showing off his charge and loading one down with literature.
