

More Veterans Get Benefits

Additional World War I veterans and widows will be entitled to state and local benefits as the result of passage of Senate Bill 411 by the 1963 legislature, Ed Miles, Clackamas county veterans' service officer, said today.

The new law extends the dates of military service for defining a World War I veteran under Oregon law, thus liberalizing entitlement of World War I veterans and widows to state property tax exemption and house trailer license exemption. The change took effect May 1.
