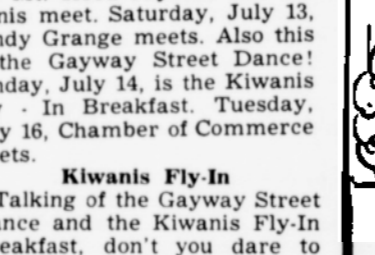
"Not only do some of the main speakers travel with the assembly around the world but so do a large body of delegates," Larson stated.
