Traffic Deaths Hit High Mark

More people died in Oregon traffic during the first six months of this year than in any comparable period in the state's history.

The Traffic Safety Division of the Oregon Department of Motor Vehicles said the tentative toll of 251 was more than 29 per cent above the six-month toll in 1962.

The month - by - month breakdown of traffic deaths shows 31 in January; 27, February; 56, March; 32, April; 52, May; and 53 in June. The March and May tolls were all-time records for those months.
