Fire Threat Lower Here

Clackamas county officials stated last week that the fire threat, said to be tremendous in most of the Pacific Northwest, is only slightly higher than last year's in Clackamas county.

The county has some 5,000 acres of timber and pays the Clackamas - Marion Fire Protection district to be responsible for its protection.

Although the state forester may find it necessary to close double the usual amount of acreage to recreation during hot weather, this county's only problem would develop at Eagle Fern. Dick Wilmot, Clackamas county park supervisor, said this could be remedied in 30-60 days. He says Clackamas county has never, to his knowledge, closed a park because of fire danger.
