Adventists Slate Meeting

Over 3,000 Seventh-Day Adventists, laymen from 371 churches in the Pacific Northwest will attend the Laymen's Congress scheduled to be held at Gladstone Park, Portland July 24-27 according to Pastor W. D. Breese of the Sandy district. The purpose of the congress is to inspire and train laymen in effective methods of lay evangelism and Christian welfare activities. "Laymen on the March for Christ" is the theme of the congress.

Official delegates to the congress have been chosen by Adventist churches in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, British Columbia, Alberta and Alaska. Mr. and Mrs. John B. Edwards and Mr. and Mrs. E. O. Wertman have been chosen to represent Sandy Adventists at the congress. Besides laymen it is expected there will be over 300 ministers and pastors in attendance.

The program will be under the direction of D. E. Caslow, director of Lay activities for the North Pacific Union Conference. Guest speakers will include R. L. Watts vice president of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists Washington, D. C. J. E. Edwards, secretary of Home Missions and associate secretaries Adlae Esteb, Carl Guenther and A. W. Schoen.

What's Cooking?

Applesauce Spice Cake

1/2 c. sweetened apple sauce
1/2 c. sugar
4 tablespoons lard, unsalted shortening, butter or margarine

1 1/2 c. reg. flour
Stir these ingredients together; add 1 level tsp. soda, 1 tablespoon hot water and stir. Then add 1 tsp. cinnamon, not quite 1/2 tsp. cloves, and not quite 1/2 tsp. nutmeg. Pour into oiled and floured 13"x9" pan. Then sprinkle 1/2 c. granulated sugar mixed with 1/2 tsp. cinnamon over the batter. Bake for one hour at 350 degrees. The sugar and cinnamon are the only frosting needed.

Cherry Nut Cake

1 1/2 c. sugar
1/2 c. shortening (unsalted) pinch salt
1 tsp. vanilla
2 1/2 c. sifted flour
2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 c. English walnuts chopped
3 egg whites

Pour oil liquid from small jar of marischew cherries and fill cup with sweet milk. Cut up nuts and cherries. Mix as butter cake and add egg whites last. Bake in long 13 inch by 9 inch pan for 45 min. in 350 degree oven. Frost sparingly with a little powdered sugar frosting. This cake freezes well. If you wish you may cut in 1/2 and make a layer cake,

Frozen Dessert

1 box instant pudding mix
1 cup water
1 pt. ice cream
Mix all together, pour into graham cracker crust.
20 graham crackers crushed
1/2 lb. butter or margarine (melted)
1/2 cup sugar
Store in freezer until ready to serve.

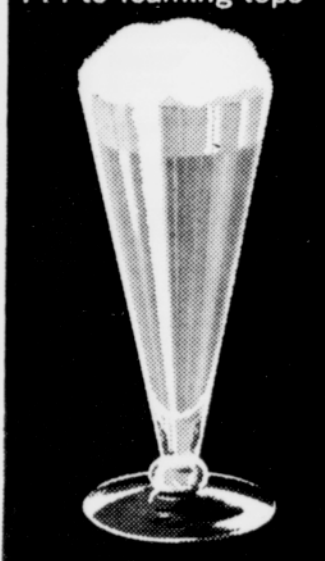

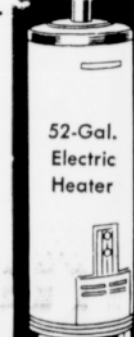
