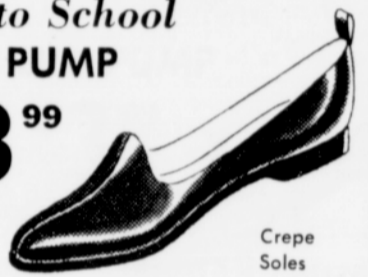

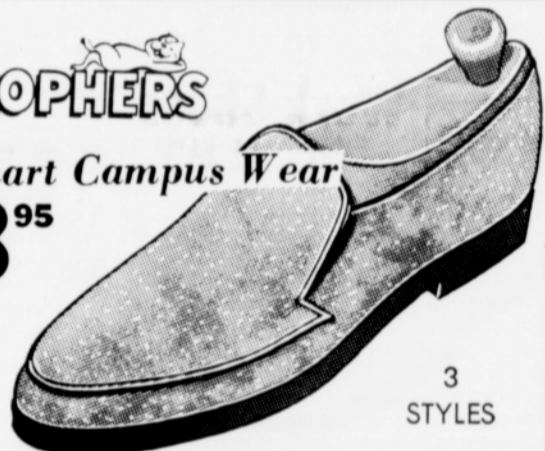

The late Judge John R. Mears succeeded Ross as president. Ormond R. Bean has served for the past several years as secretary. Worth Caldwell Sr. followed the judge in the presidency and in 1962 John L. Carpenter was elected president.

Board members of the association are elected each year from among many prominent citizens. Miss Hoefs, Dykstra, Hamilton, Ross and Kneeland are still active in the association.

## Smoking Tips For Razor Clams

Clam tides are good and the diggers are reporting success so here are a couple of favorite methods for smoking clams.

**Smoked Razor Clams** —  
(a) Steam clams for several minutes and shake out the meats.

(b) Clean the clams (in the usual way) by removing the stomachs and splitting the necks. Wash in fresh water.

(c) Cut clams in three sections — neck, foot, and mantle.

(d) Soak in the following brine mixture for 5 minutes (1/2 gallon of water to 12 ounces of salt).

(e) Rinse and drain for 15 minutes.

(f) Smoke for half hour with door or dampers open (lots of ventilation and light cool smoke).

(g) Close smoke door and smoke for 2 hours.

(h) Give a hot smoke to raise temperature to around 140F and smoke to a final half hour.

**Smoked Littlenecks, Butter, Quahog, and Blue Clams** —

(a) Follow steps through (e) as listed for razors.

(b) Steam clams for 10 minutes or until swelled.

(c) Smoke for 1 hour at 85-90F.

(d) Smoke for half hour at 140F.

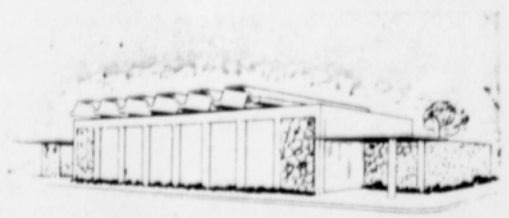
