Mt. Hood National Forest Weekly Recreation Report

The Abbott and Frazier Rds. on the Estacada district have been graded so the going shouldn't be quite so rough as it has been into the Shining, Serene and Rock lakes country. Rangers on the Hood River and Columbia Gorge districts have stressed that the Kingsley road into Wahtum and Rainy lake not be used at this time. Best way to these lakes is via Dee, and the Scot lake road. Since the mill at Dee is on strike, there are very few log trucks on these back roads. These roads have recently been oiled so your trip shouldn't be too dusty. The Lolo Pass road east of the pass is rough and bumpy.

Crews are still working on the Skyline Rd. in the Olallie lake area. You should expect equipment on this road through this month. Work has begun on placing a good layer of rock on this road in the chronic bad spots near Olallie and Breitenbush lakes. For a time, the new rock surface may be a nuisance to motorists until it has been compacted.

Trails
The Zig Zag Canyon crossing has temporarily washed out on the Timberline trail. Ranger Wingle reports that it should be repaired by August. Check with the Zig Zag Ranger station before attempting to cross however.

Ranger Carr of the Collawash districts reports the following trails open: Silver King, Round Lake, Bagby Hot Springs, Oge Creek No. 5, and trails to all lookouts are open. Inquire at the Ripplebrook Ranger station about all others. On the Hood River district, most trails leading to the Timberline trail are open. Coe creek may be crossed ½ mile below the Timberline trail. Generally, trails on the forest are just partially maintained and you should inquire on any specific trails at the Ranger stations or Supervisor's office in Portland.

Campgrounds
Campgrounds are all open except Lost Lake during the week and Big Eddy. Work continues at Hidaway lake and Peg Leg falls campgrounds. The Lost Creek Horse camp on the Zig Zag district was dedicated last month. This campground will be used primarily as a base camp for horsemen. There is an unloading ramp for stock plus several hitching posts; a

starting point for many beautiful, scenic trail rides.

Fishing
Lake Lenore in the Bull of the Woods area is reported to have exceptional fishing. Fishermen are seen fishing for sturgeon and steelhead in the Columbia river with many catching their limit. Trout fishing is fair in the upper lakes and streams in the Columbia Gorge district. Lost lake has been good on trolled flies or flatfish. The East Fork of Hood river has been fair from Rob-inhood campground to the forest boundary.

Fire Danger
Fire danger is gradually increasing. Please be careful with campfires. As a courtesy, when you camp in an undeveloped campground, and plan on building campfires, notify the closest Lookout, Guard station or Ranger station where you are going and approximately how long you will be in the area. This way, these stations will not report a forest fire when it is only a campfire. Be careful along highway 35 since there is slash along the highway and it is considered a severe hazard.

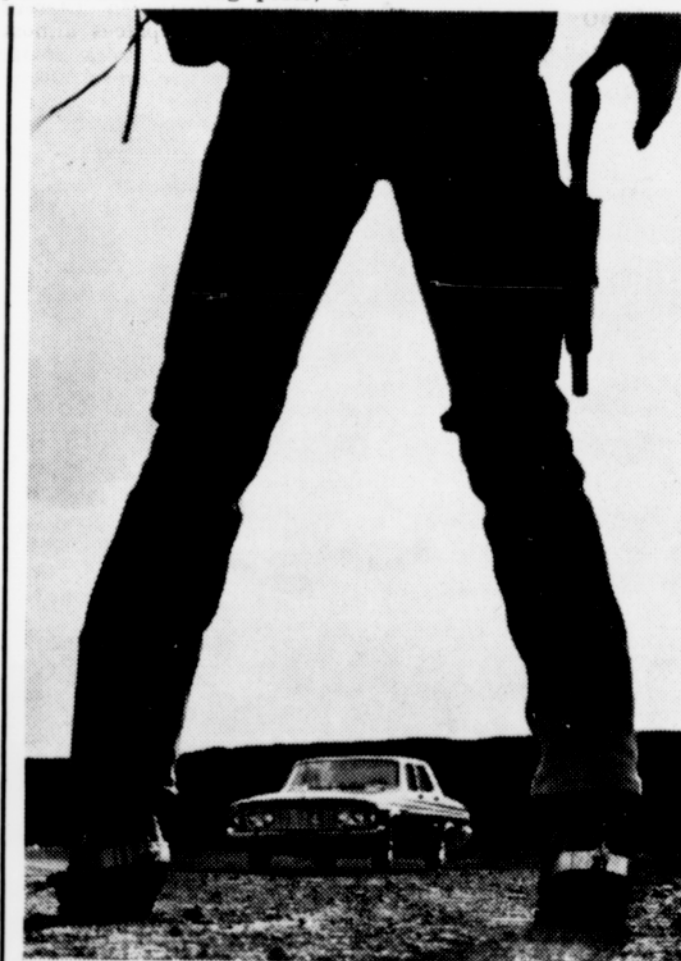
Special Items
Wild flowers in the high meadows near Breitenbush lake are all in full bloom. On the Bear Springs district, huckleberries are ripe in the lower elevations; however, the overall crop will not be ripe for at least two more weeks. Our Lakes district says the crop appears to be good this year. This office will put out a special report when the berries are ripe.

A suggested hike is to stop at Hood River meadows campground and take the 2-3 hour hike through scenic upland meadows to Umbrella falls.

Our recreation guard at Larch mountain reports seeing a mountain lion and several bobcats in the area.

A number of surfaced parking areas have been constructed along the Clackamas River Rd. near Austin Hot Springs. The public is invited to use these parking areas and the garbage cans provided for litter.
