### Kelso Farmers Union Hosts State President Bob Elkins

State President and Mrs. Bob Elkins were guests at the July meeting of the Kelso Farmers Union at the Frank Belangy home. In speaking to the 40 members present, Elkins stated that if the present trend continues there will be no family farms in 10 years. He also discussed central exchange, co-ops, organizing and the meeting with Don Eklund at the Farmers Union camp.

It was announced that the Farmers Union annual state picnic will be at Champooog state park on Sunday, Aug. 18.

Michael Olson reported on the reserve class which has recently been started. Carolyn Haneberg, Glenna Olson and Stanley Buehler told about the Farmers Union camp at Silver Falls where they had been. Stanley Buehler played a clarinet solo.

Elkins said these young folks are given \$1,000 life insurance policy paid for one year when they have finished a year of educational work in the Farmers Union.

Melvine Haneberg, speaking on co-ops, said they make for better marketing of farm produce. He added that membership varies greatly in different areas. In some places almost everyone belongs to a co-op, whereas in other areas no one does.

Glen Olson discussed an article on deterrents. He stressed the comment Oregon may become another smog area.

Vance Hewitt commented on the amount of useless literature sent out by the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture — useless because it does not concern farmers in all areas. He also brought out the statistic that there is one Dept. of Agriculture employee for every 28 farmers.

### Clackamas Fair Hosts Coin Show

The Clackamas County Fair will once again be host to one of the largest coin shows in the Northwest. Twenty-two or more dealers will have tables along the walls of the 5,000 feet of floor space devoted to the coin show.

Exhibits will fill in the center of the area. Juniors under 18 years will find a special classification with trophy awards in separate classes. Adult exhibits which are the best in the class will receive trophy awards, also.

The Coin show is free. There will be no charge for registration although all visitors will be encouraged to register. Free drawings will be made frequently. Rare coins will be given away, as well as trade coupons so that the winner may choose a special coin to suit his need.
