

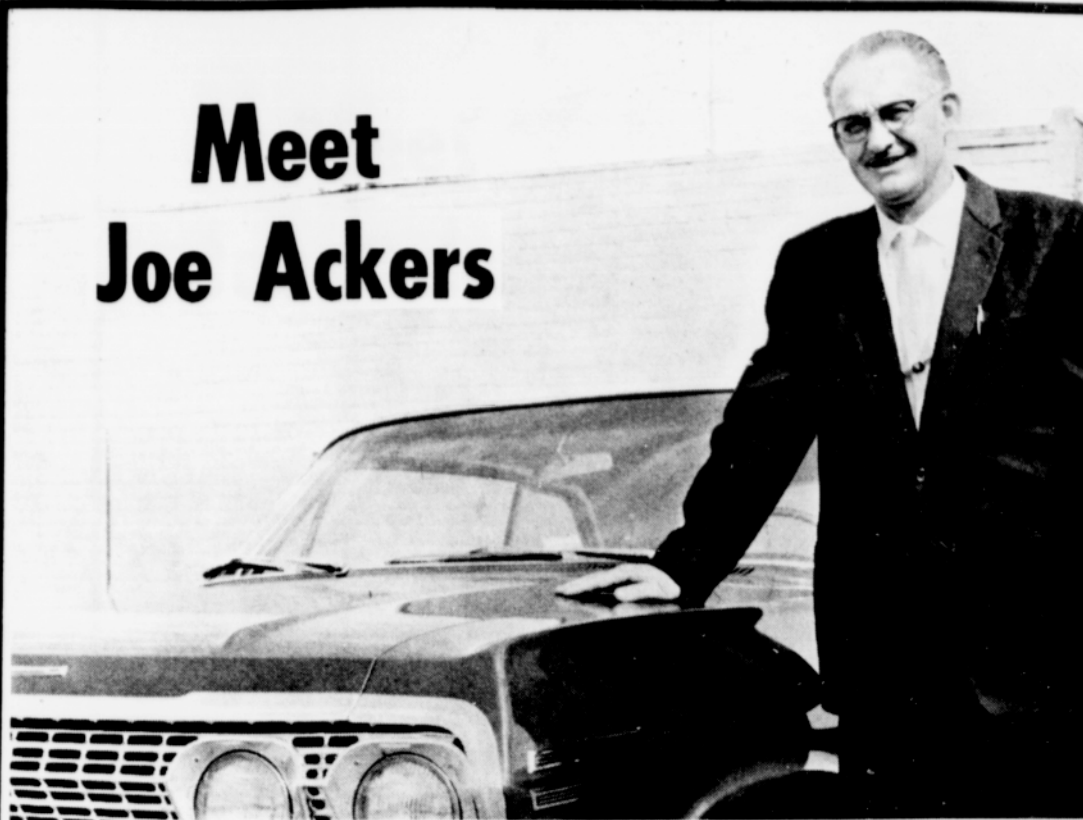
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SCOUTS ATTEND CAMP

Fire District Closes Areas

Areas 1 and 2 in the Clackamas-Marion Fire District were officially closed last week. The action closed these areas to all entry except by written permit.

Permits will not be issued for recreational purposes for the duration of the closures. The riding of motor vehicles such as motorcycles, motor bikes, scooters, etc., is also prohibited and violators are subject to arrest unless they have a written permit.

The public is also reminded that it is illegal to build a fire on the land of another without the landowner's permission and this includes campfires.

The closures were deemed necessary due to increasingly dry forest conditions, coupled with the serious blowdown conditions.

cont. from Page 1 annual meeting at Meford \$50, for a total of \$275.

Hawaii Trip Planned
It was announced that the NACD Pacific Area VII meets Dec. 10-12 in Hawaii with arrangements available for a \$275.35 package trip for SCD supervisors. This trip, it was pointed out, is a tax-deductible expenditure.

In talking to the group concerning small watersheds projects, Anderson said possibilities of this type of development had been suggested for Tickle creek and Deep creek. In this sort of thing, he emphasized, there is a need to think ahead as it takes about 15 years to really get such projects going.

New cooperators in the district are Oliver Burns who has 42 acres in pasture and dam on Amasacker road, L. G. Brian who has a trout and tree farm eight miles southeast of Sandy, Phillip Cousin who has 122 and 160 acres at Shorty's Corner, Robert Wilhelm who has 78 acres, mostly alder, right off Cherryville road, and Bruce Irving who has 160 acres in the George area, mostly livestock with some grass seed.

Trout Farms Start
Harold James told the group he had received three applications for the recreation type trout ponds with a commercial fish business such as L. G. Brian's.

It was pointed out that there is money to be loaned for this type of development, but soil conservationists recommend that such projects should be run as a supplemental sideline by persons who have a regular income.

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
