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LEGISLATIVE NOTES

This report comes to you from Chicago where I attended the Conference of Chief State School Officials. Dr. Leon P. Minear, Oregon's Superintendent of Public Instruction, is chairman of the group, and officiated at the two-day conference.

The conference was called to discuss the problems which are common to the various state departments of education. In many areas new techniques have been developed. Some techniques have worked out well, and will be adopted in other states. Other methods are still in the process of perfection, and the interchange of ideas gives a chance to improve experimental programs.

The honored guest was the U.S. Commissioner of Education, Mr. Francis Keppel. The U. S. Office of Education is part of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Each of these units has its own department, with Mr. Keppel heading education.

The U. S. Office of Education was created by an act of Congress in 1867 for the purpose of collecting and reporting information on the condition and progress of education. This is still the function of the U. S. Office, which in addition

provides consultative leadership. Among other topics of discussion was the extent of the role of the Office of Education in state programs. Consideration was also given to the development of a climate hospitable to experimentation, innovation, and change and improvement within State departments.

Along with other significant developments, outstanding achievements were reported by Georgia, where area technical vocational schools have been developed. Dr. Minear reported on the improvements in teaching which were resulting from the "Oregon Program," primarily financed by the Ford Foundation.

As we chatted, Commissioner Keppel indicated to me that the biggest problem he feels is that of creating a sense of urgency. "Since education is so closely related to the economic life of our country and to real equality of opportunity, something has to be done in a hurry in this area," he said. As Dr. Minear has put it, "Tomorrow's citizens are in school today. Their schooling period occurs only once. If we are to help them, it must be done now."

What's Cooking?

Green Tomato Mince Meat
1 peck (8 qts.) green tomatoes ground coarsely
2 tablespoons canning salt
3 lbs. brown sugar
2 lbs. raisins
1 cup suet and 1/2 cup water
3 lbs. apples (ground coarse) grated rind of one orange
3 lemons (pulp and Juice)
2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
1 tsp. ea. of ground cloves and nutmeg.

Method: Wash and quarter green tomatoes. Run through food chopper. Sprinkle salt over them and allow to stand for one hour. Drain, cover with cold water. Place over fire and boil for 5 minutes. Drain off liquid. Add ground coarse and 1/2 cup water and simmer 20 minutes. Stir in sugar and boil dissolved. Add other ingredients and boil until thick, 20 or 30 minutes. Can in sterilized hot jars. Makes 9 to 10 pints. This recipe was given to me by Peggy Patchell of Lebanon.

Green Tomato Relish

Grind 8 lbs. green tomatoes quartered. Mix 1/2 cup canning salt in them and let stand 6 hours or overnight. Grind 1 small head of cabbage, 3 green peppers, 2 red sweet peppers and 3 medium onions.

Drain tomatoes dry. Put all in kettle and add 4 cups vinegar, 4 cups sugar, 1 tablespoon dry mustard, 1/2 tsp. turmeric and 1 scant tablespoon whole cloves. Put cloves in bag and remove before canning. Cook over medium heat until onions are tender, 30 - 45 minutes. Makes about 8 pints. This recipe was given to me by Mrs. Sherman, Lebanon.

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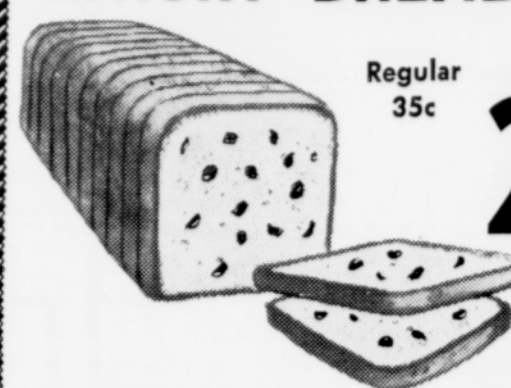
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
