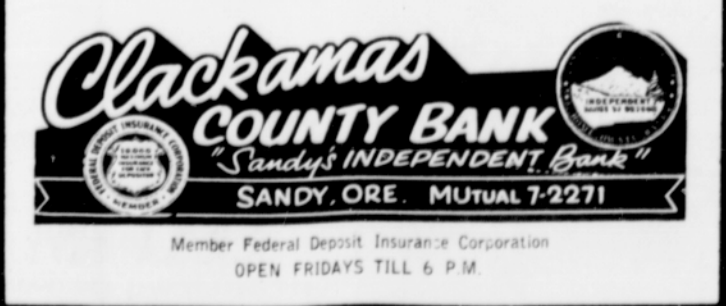

According to Wills the over 600,000 laying hens in the county return nearly 3-1/2 million dollars annual income.

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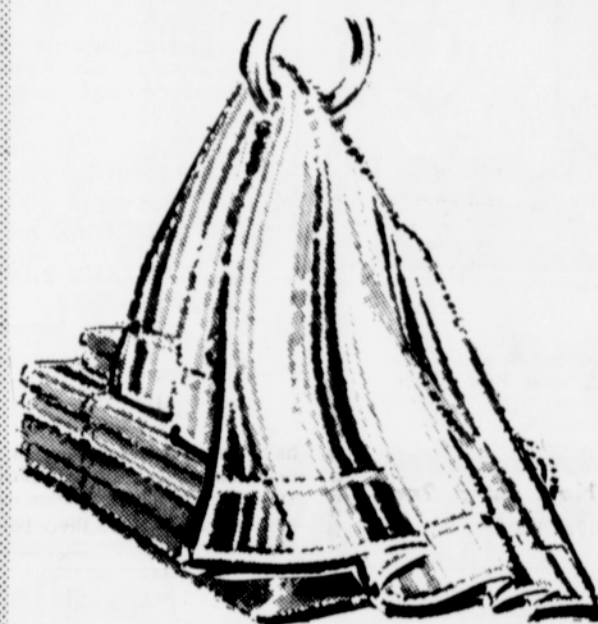
