Set Guidance For Students

Students of Sandy High School will hear representatives of the State System of Higher Education in a special guidance session to be held at the high school Dec. 5 at 1:17 p.m.

The presentation is planned jointly by the State System of Higher Education and the high school to supplement the regular guidance program with first hand information about colleges. The visitors will explain the academic offerings, specific requirements for admission, tuition and incidental fees, and scholarship opportunities at the various public institutions.

Representatives will stress the importance of a good high school record in preparing for any type of education, training or occupation beyond high school. Of special emphasis will be the fact that retention of standards in colleges follow the pattern of higher admis-

sion requirements and thus necessitate adequate preparation early in the high school years.

Students who have demonstrated the ability to do academic work will be urged to consider the possibility of attending college. Others will be encouraged to seek training beyond high school to be better prepared for future careers.

The State System representatives included on the visitation team are Waldo Bowers from Oregon State University, Vernon Barkhurst from the University of Oregon, Eugene Larsen from Oregon Technical Institute, Stanley Kenyon from Oregon College of Education, Miss Jean Boyle from the University of Oregon School of Nursing, Robert Taylor from Portland State College, and J. Richard Pizzo from the High School - College Relations Committee.

LETTER BOX

November 18, 1963

A Portland daily paper recently commented editorially—"This newspaper is disturbed by Representative Norblad's poor attendance record." To the contrary, I have one of the best records in Congress and wish to set the record straight for the benefit of my constituents.

Congressional Quarterly reports the following attendance figures (roll call votes) for the 87th Congress (1961-1962) as follows: Norblad 93%; Durno 90%; Ullman 84%; Morse 84%; Green 81%; Neuberger 77%.

Congressional Quarterly's attendance figures for the preceding 86th Congress (1959-1960) shows the average attendance of Members of Congress that year was 82%, putting me 11 percentage points above the average.

No Trespassing, Hunter Beware

Any person who enters upon the land of another without authorization is a trespasser. A trespasser may be subjected to a civil liability or criminal penalties or both, depending upon the applicable law. By common law, a trespasser is liable to the landowner for damage caused to the land or the structures thereon by reason of the trespass. This civil liability for damages applies to any lands of another whether or not they are enclosed or cultivated.

In addition to the civil liability, the Oregon legislature has enacted several statutes imposing criminal penalties by way of either imprisonment or fine or both for trespass on cultivated or enclosed lands.

One statute makes a misdemeanor of the mere entry on enclosed lands and refusal to depart upon verbal, written or printed notice of the lawful occupant of such lands. This statute defines enclosed lands as "any barrier such as a river, lake or other obstruction to the passage of stock and also the established and posted boundaries of Indian reservations within the State." It further provides that the printed or written notices must contain the name of the owner or lawful occupancy of the lands and must be posted in three conspicuous places on the lands. Posting applies to all persons other than the owners or lawful occupants of lands. Therefore, the landowner may hunt on his land whether posted or not, as can anyone else who obtains permission to do so.

A special statute applicable to hunters further provides that a person hunting with a gun or dog on cultivated or enclosed lands of another without permission can be prosecuted upon the signing of a complaint by the owner, occupant or lessee of such lands.

In addition to the civil liability imposed under common law and the criminal penalties imposed by the statutory law, the Oregon legislature has enacted another statute to discourage trespassing. It provides that a licensed hunter or angler criminally convicted of destroying or damaging anyone's personal or real property shall lose his hunting or fishing license for the remainder of that year and for the succeeding year.
