Quote "The memory of two Welches, Ore. brothers, both killed in World War II, was honored, when the Oregon Geographic Names Board, gave the name Stein Falls to the first of seven waterfalls in the deep Salmon river canyon in the Mt. Hood National Forest. Johnny and Bobby Stein, an Air Corpsman and a Marine, were the sons of Mr. and Mrs. John Stein, longtime resident of Welches. They also named the rest of the falls on the Salmon.

Beginning with Stein Falls, 2.1 miles downstream from the point where Linney Creek flows into the Salmon River, the board also gave the names Split, Little Niagara, Vanishing, Frustration and Final to falls on the Salmon River, and Hideaway to falls on Tumbling Creek, a tributary of the Salmon.

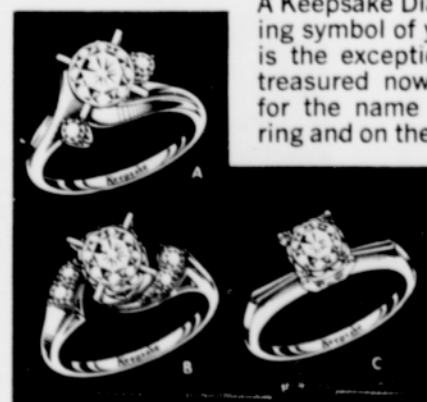
County Democrats Delay Convention Preparation
