PGE Engineers to Speak To Pupils at Bull Run

Ted Parcher, safety engineer for Portland General Electric company, will present a demonstration on "Electric Power and Common Sense" to Bull Run school Friday, at 10:30 a.m.

The PGE expert will use a miniature power line a motion picture to illustrate basic rules in handling electricity.

The motion picture will illustrate several ways in which people can encounter difficulty and electricity. By using a scale model, Parcher will point out the dangers in situations involving high voltage, kite flying automobile accidents and other conditions.

Electricity when properly handled is completely safe, Parcher will explain. However, the quantity of electricity sufficient to

operate a 50-watt light bulb can also seriously injure a person who is careless and allows himself to become a part of the circuit between two live wires or between one live wire and the ground.

The lectures are a part of PGE's continuing safety education program conducted in cooperation with schools within the utility's service area.

With the help of the Junior Safety Patrol, teachers and police officers, your child is learning how to cross streets carefully and be safe when they are near busy traffic. The Portland Traffic Safety Commission warns that parents have the most important responsibility for the safety of youngsters. Good example should be the most effective part of their safety education.
