He was stationed at Fort Bragg, N.C., before arriving on Okinawa on this tour of duty in February of this year.

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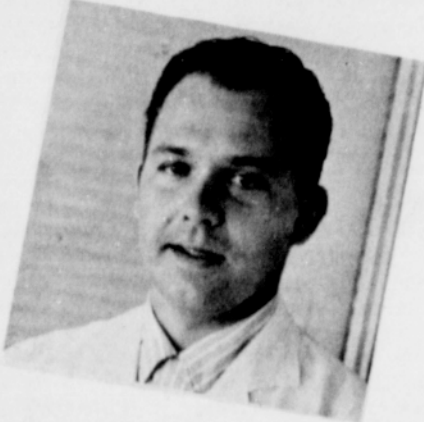
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
