the fishermen's guide

Melvin Weseman of Welches, author of the Fisherman's Guide, is not a professional fisherman but has all the enthusiasm and enjoyment of the devoted amateur.

Fishing has been his personal hobby and pastime since he was a boy in Eugene. With his wife, Mary, and two sons, Michael, 5, and three-year-old Chris, he has made his home on Mt. Hood since April.

There are many and varied lakes in the Mt. Hood area with excellent fishing. Some are easily accessible by car, and even better fishing can be had by hiking in a few miles.

Badger Lake was my last trip on the mountain, a good-sized lake at the end of a "primitive" road. Since I could drive in, a friend and I took a small rubber raft. Had pretty fair luck on a number fourteen tied-down bucktall Caddis and Super-duper lure. I got nice fish, seven over 8 inches, both Eastern Brook and Rainbow.

In the afternoon a wind came up making the lake choppy. We drifted with it along the shore line, towing fly bobbers with a ten foot leader and the tied-down caddis. I got a lot of strikes and landed about six of mine then.

At the mouth of an inlet stream I saw one fish as big as my arm, and not to be telling a fisherman's tale, it was at least 24-25 inches long. As I tried to see if they were Eastern Brook or Rainbow, I spotted two more of the big fellows just laying there. That was right before my foot slipped into the water! They were gone in a flash.

When the sun dropped behind the mountain, the wind died, and the lake became glass smooth. That ended it for the boat fisherman. The disturbance was too great. Fish were rising all over the lake in droves. Now was the time an experienced fly fisherman in the 16 to 18 size hook category could really slaughter them.

Badger Lake has regular camping facilities with tables, outdoor stoves, tent sites and toilets.

To reach it, go past Government Camp and take the Mt. Hood Loop Highway. Drive two miles past White River Park and take the road to the right, it has a sign "Badger Lake". Go five miles until the road forks, take the left hand fork. About two miles

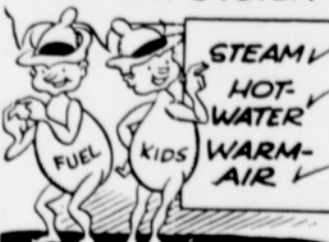
