

Navy Tells New Reserve Officer Program Out

The Navy Department announced recently that a New Two-Year Contract Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps Program has been established, whereby students who are sophomores in good standing at accredited colleges, universities or junior colleges may make application to enroll at any of the colleges or universities at which NROTC Units are located.

Selected candidates will enroll in a special six-week training session which will be conducted during the period 10-17 June to 20-31 July 1965, at selected NROTC Universities. It is anticipated that the University of California at Los Angeles will be the participating university on the West Coast.

Selected applicants must arrange for their own tuition, room, board, and transportation to and from the special summer session. They will receive pay at the rate of \$78 per month during the summer session.

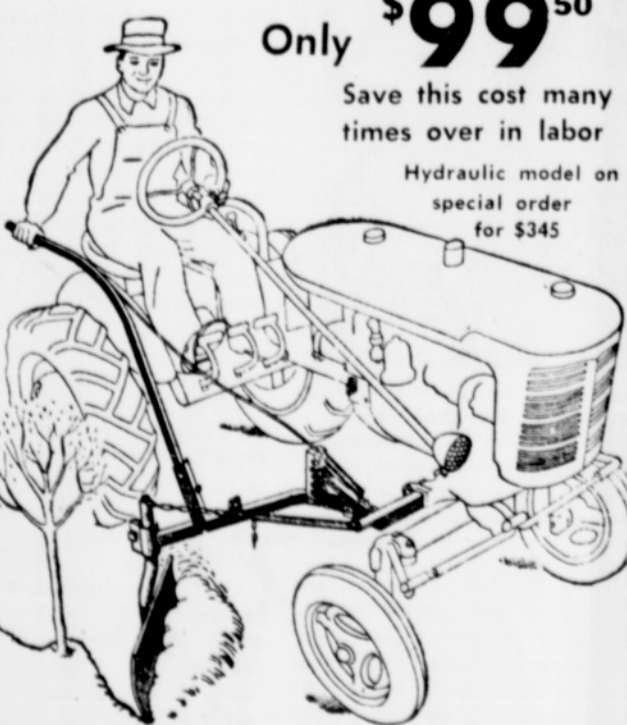
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Slot-Car Racing Due Fun Center

Three Gresham men -- a photographer, a carpenter and a lumber dealer -- have brought their diverse talents together in a project to introduce a new amusement business in Gresham.

The enterprise is slot-car racing, and the track is in remodeled basement quarters of the Fun Center building, 611 E. Powell.

Proprietors are Duane Kinneer, the photographer, his father Vernie Kinneer, the carpenter, and Howard Chalker Jr., the lumber dealer.

In slot racing, miniature cars speed around a track of elaborate design. Each electric ally driven car fits into a slot that is lined with cable that transmits power to the car's motor. A sophisticated track, such as to be in use here, provides eight lanes of racing and its design offers a challenge to the operator's skill.

The Fun Center course, however, will have three tracks, says Dee Kinneer.

One, 220 feet distance, will be the equivalent of a mile on scale. Another will be 260 feet long with a Pike's Peak, and the third will be sanctions track with chicane curves.

"In addition there will be a drag strip 88 feet long.

"There will be a pit area for repair and maintenance of racers and custom-built control stands for each operator.

"Use of cable conductor in-

stead of tape will provide more current for the racers, and the woven cable material will stand up longer under wear.

"The track is built with rubber molding with turned lip on the curves to protect the racers.

"We'll carry a complete line of parts and kits and motors. We'll have cars for sale and cars for rent. Many will own their own cars.

"We are going to promote team competition, with trophies for the winners. Already, sponsors have signed up for teams."

The objective in slot-car racing is to get to the finish line first, which is easier said than done. A car pushed too fast leaves the slot, and each miniature car differs in weight and design and responds differently to speed. For that reason, many racers own their own cars so they can learn to handle it most efficiently.

The sport is aimed at teenage participants but soon comes to have a following of all ages. He said target date for opening is this weekend.

Water Requirements for Families

Do you know how much water your family uses? A U. S. Department of Agriculture farm study shows the average daily use is 55 gallons per person per day, reports Mrs. Helen McDowall, Clackamas County Extension Agent. However, there were many variations -- from 32 to 102 gallons per person per day.

The amount of water used in laundering depends on the type of equipment you use. For 200 families interviewed, those with automatic washers used 74 gallons per week contrasted with 26 gallons per week for homes with non-automatic washers.

Undoubtedly the people with automatics will say the conven-

ience is worth every extra drop. But families in some areas may not have a plentiful water supply available. It's well to keep the potential water supply in mind when looking for a home site or buying water-using appliances.

Never follow another car too close. If you have room to pass, get by and don't let a long string of cars form behind you.
