Ten sixth grader track competitors from Sandy grade school qualified Monday in the District Track Meet held at Rockwood to compete in the forthcoming Multnomah County Meet. First and second place winners in the district cinder meet are eligible to enter the county competition.

Continuing their winning form the sixth grade tracksters picked up six of the eight possible first places in the various events Monday. Dennis Welsen led the first place winners picking up three of them.

Portland Youths Admit Brightwood Cabin Fire

Two 15-year-old Portland youths admitted setting fire to a cabin located at Brightwood in an area known as Swiss Gardens following their arrest as suspects last Thursday by Clackamas County Sheriff's Deputy Tom Cutsforth. The cabin belonged to Fred Hohl of Portland.

When questioned by juvenile authorities as to their motives one of youths answered, "... for something to do."

The fire was noticed by R. E. Fischer and Ken Burdick, employees of Sandy Lumber and Hardware Co., as they drove past the area. They notified Ed Cook at Cook Motel in Brightwood who immediately summoned the Brightwood Volunteer Firemen to extinguish the blaze. Cook, himself, is the fire chief.

The two fellows reporting the fire had noticed two youth traveling east a short distance from

the fire area. A short time later the same youths were noticed heading west and they stopped at a filling station and phoned authorities.

The youths admitted burglarizing the cabin and later kicking over some ornamental fencing, throwing a lawnmower into a nearby pond, then torching the cabin.

They found some paint thinner, doused a mattress and piled some furniture and used book matches to ignite it.
