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What's Cooking?

PINEAPPLE DESSERT

Put 1 cup milk in top of double boiler and add 1 lb. 16 oz. marshmallows cut up. When thoroughly dissolved, remove from heat and cool slightly. Add 1 small can crushed pineapple and juice. Cool until cold. Whip 1 pint of whipping cream. Slowly add the marshmallow mixture to the whipped cream. Crush 12 graham crackers. Spread one-half the crushed crackers in the bottom of pan, pour the pineapple dessert mixture on slowly and put remaining one-half crushed crackers over the top. Serves 8-10. DOUBLE CRUNCHERS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Sift together 1 cup sifted flour, 1/2 teaspoon baking soda and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Set aside. Combine 1/2 cup shortening, 1/2 cup granulated sugar and 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed. Beat until light and creamy. Blend in 1 egg and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla. Stir in flour mixture. Add 1 cup corn flakes, crushed, 1 cup quick rolled oats and 1/2 cup coconut. Remove 1/3 of dough; reserve.

Shape remaining 2/3 of dough into balls using level teaspoonfuls; place on greased cookie sheet. Flatten with bottom of glass dipped in flour. Bake at 350 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes.

Shape reserved dough into balls, using half teaspoonfuls. Bake on greased cookie sheets at 350 degrees for 8 minutes. Cool.

Prepare chocolate filling: Melt over hot water 1-6 oz. pkg. (1 cup) semi-sweet chocolate morsels with 1/2 cup confectioner's sugar and 1 Tablespoon water. Blend in 1-3 oz. pkg. (1/3 cup) soft cream cheese; beat until smooth. Cool. Spread filling over larger cookies and top with small ones. Yield: 3-1/2 dozen. From the files of Sara Sewell Berger, Sandy.

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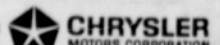
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
