NOTICE OF ELECTION ON FORMATION OF AREA EDUCATION DISTRICT
Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in the following described territory in Multnomah, Clackamas, and Hood River Counties in Oregon, on Thursday, June 3, 1965, from 2:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Oregon Standard Time for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters the question of the formation of an Area Education District, to be known as the East Side Area Education District, in accordance with Chapter 100, Section 307, Oregon Laws, 1965, and the election of the first Board of Directors thereof, as required by Chapter 100, Section 311, Oregon Laws 1965.

The proposed district established by the State Board of Education shall constitute and include the territories contained within the boundaries of the following political subdivisions of the State of Oregon, as such boundaries existed on November 1, 1964:
