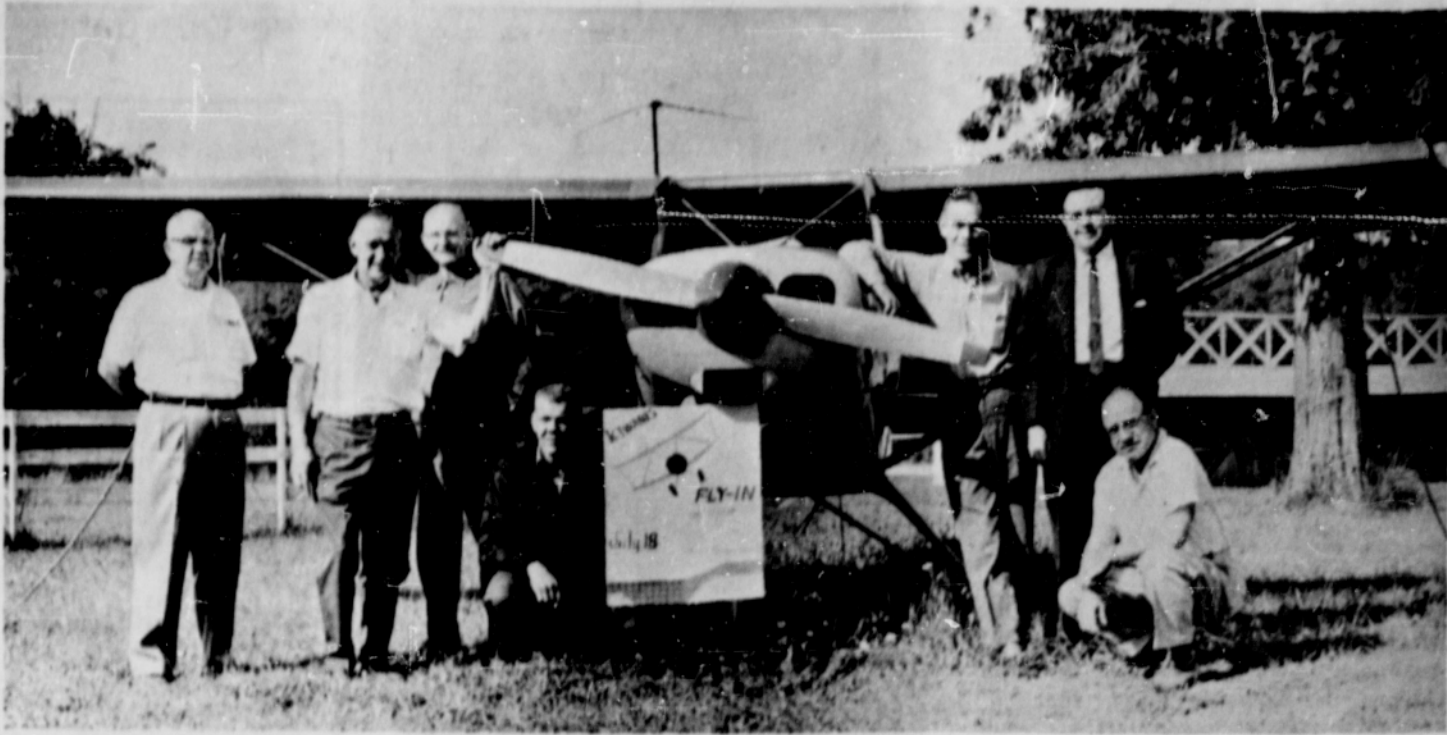

Olin Bignall, general chairman for the Kiwanis Fly-In Breakfast, reports that arrangements have been made for six to eight antique airplanes to be at Rich's Airport on Sunday, July 18.

A group called Northwest Antique Airplane Club with its headquarters at Evergreen Airport, Vancouver, Wash., assured the Kiwanis of Sandy this week that they would have a number of their planes here for showing. These planes will be available for the public to observe, Bignall said.
